

Chaplain Gefell Named Captain

U. S. Army Chaplain Joseph G. Gefell of the Diocese of Rochester has been advanced to the rank of captain at his post in Osaka, Japan.

On Christmas eve he acted as subdeacon at the first Pontifical Midnight Mass to be celebrated

in Japan since the start of the war.

The Mass was offered in the Military Cathedral of Osaka by Bishop Paul Y. Taguchi, Japanese prelate, who is Bishop of Osaka and Apostolic Administrator of Shikoku.

Music for the Mass was provided by American Army personnel, the 98th Division Band, and the Stabat Mater Chorus, which is composed of Catholic Japanese girls.

Chaplain Gefell was formerly assistant pastor of St. Francis Xavier Church, Rochester.

\$213,000 Assets Reported By Parish Credit Union

A composite report of the Parish Credit Unions in Rochester shows that the credit unions have \$213,000.00 of assets. These credit unions are in Holy Family, St. Andrews, Our Lady Perpetual Help and SS. Peter and Paul parishes.

The report further shows that the members have share deposits in the credit unions of \$205,800.00; that the amount outstanding on loans to members is \$44,700.00 and that the credit union

own \$149,900.00 of United States government bonds.

Joseph H. Gervais, chairman of the Rochester conference of parish credit unions, who compiled the report, states that the credit unions range in size from \$143,000.00 of assets at Holy Family parish to \$14,000.00 in assets in SS. Peter and Paul's; that all 4 of the credit unions except Holy Family have large interest on loans at the rate of 1% a month, the rate at Holy Family being 5/8 of 1% a month. He points out that this is a substantial reduction from the rates charged by the personal loan companies where interest is charged at 2 and 2 1/2% per month.

The first parish credit union was organized in Rochester less than 9 years ago. In that time they have loan to members more than \$700,000.00 and not one cent has as yet been charged off as an uncollectible loan.
