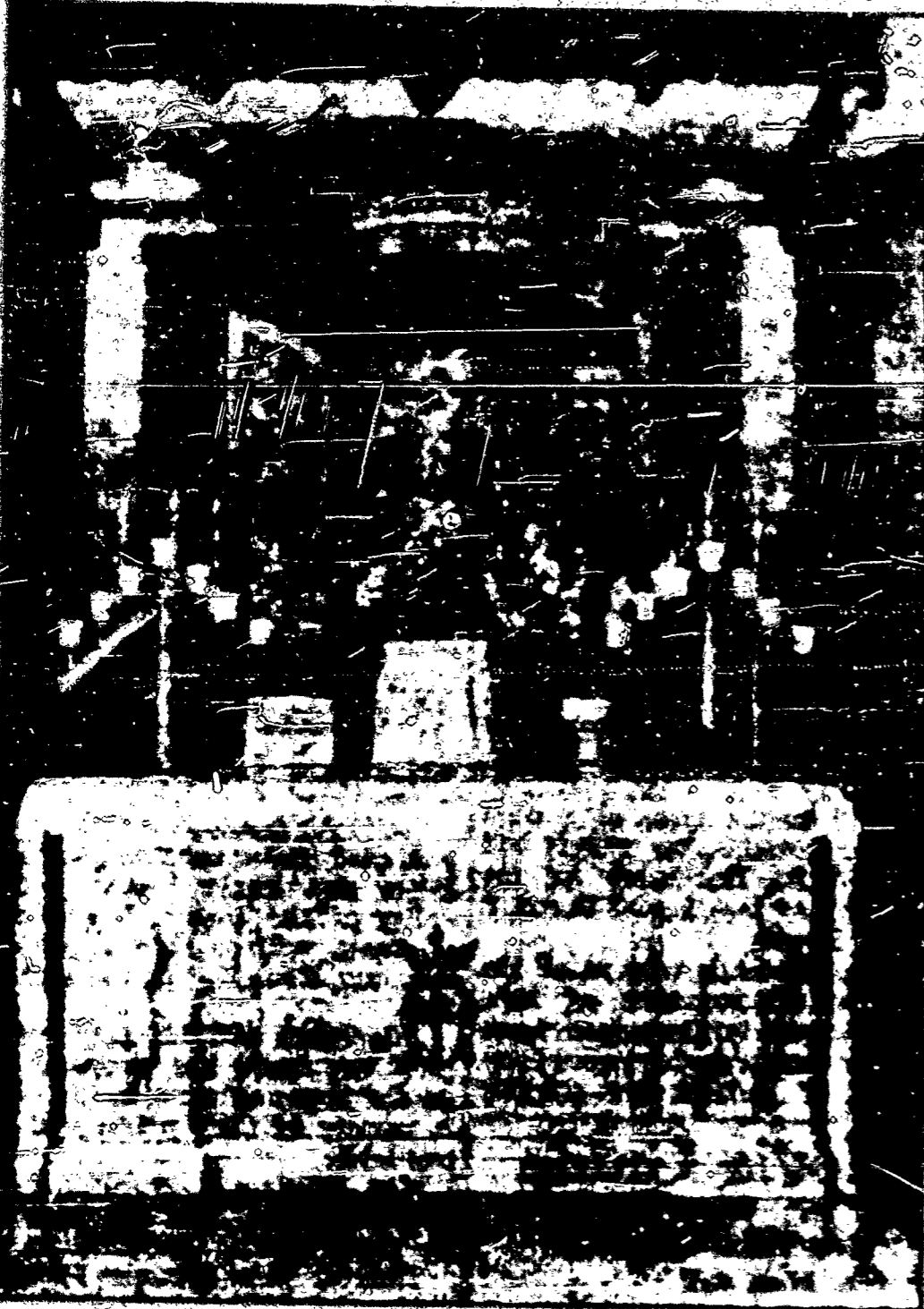


### IN A MONASTERY CHAPEL

### Girls' Center To Help Make Better Citizens, Says Bishop

More than 300 parishioners of St. Francis of Assisi parish witnessed the formal dedication Sunday of a new Girls' Center by His Excellency, Bishop Kearney.

The ceremonies were the culmination of months of work during which the center, located at 401 Orange St., was remodelled and redecorated by 244 girls and men of the parish under direction of Miss Theresa Musco.

In his address, Bishop Kearney lauded the spirit shown in establishing the center and paid tribute to the pastor, the Rev. Joseph A. Girardello, for his part in the work.

Work of remodeling the interior of the center was done by the men of St. Francis of Assisi parish who donated their time to painting and painting the walls and repairing the plumbing and electrical systems.

The girls planned the layout and decoration of the five rooms and made draperies, curtains and other accessories. Part of the furniture was obtained from local merchants and the rest purchased.

The house was previously used as a parish rectory.

### Religious Leaders Should Also Control Atomic Bomb

Education and religious leaders should be given a place with scientists in helping to control the atomic bomb. Most Rev. Richard J. Cushing, Archbishop of Boston, declared at the Institute of Religion and Social Studies here today.

The university and the church must be heard on the moral and ethical questions involved in the control of this instrument," the archbishop declared. "Our modern evaluation of scientific and science forgets that there are whole areas of human interest, human need, and human activity in which the scientist has no special contribution to make."

"The work of this new center will do much toward making better citizens because it allies Christ and his principles with the things of everyday life," the Bishop said.

The Critics' Forum, purpose of which is the "exposition of Catholic Thought on Best Sellers," holds public book reviews monthly in five cities in the United States.

**6 Years in Existence**

Founded by the Rt. Rev. John Keating Cartwright, Rector of the Cathedral of Saint Matthew and a well-known speaker and writer, the forum has been in operation for the past six years.

Such speakers as the Most Rev. Michael J. Brady, Very Rev. Edmund Walsh, S.J., Rev. James Gillis, C.S.P., and the Rev. John Tracy Ellis are among the noted literary critics who have appeared at these gatherings which attract more than a thousand persons monthly.

Recently, the I. F. C. A. took this Catholic activity under its auspices outside of Washington and is endeavoring to interest its groups in more than 60 cities in starting forums in their localities.

### Hygiene Luncheon Set

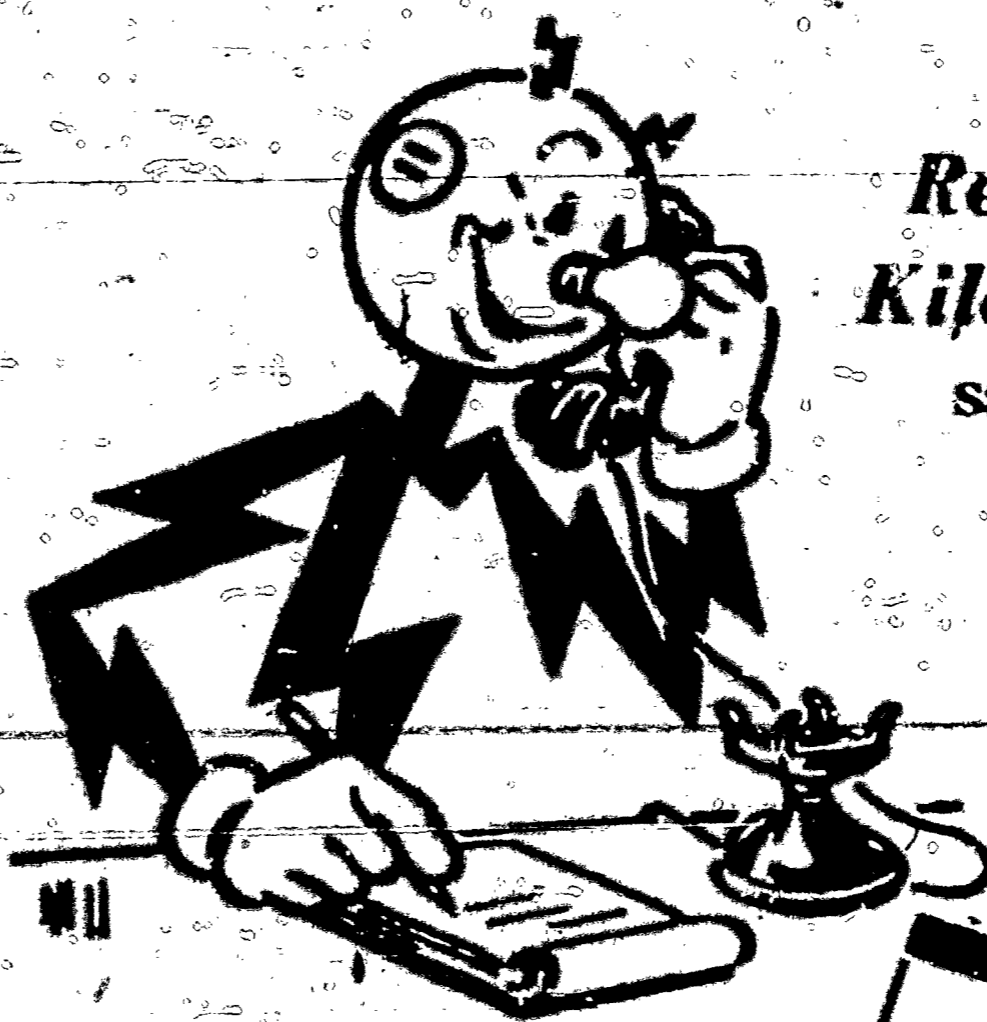
