

Fr. Sullivan, Home, Tells of India Flight

Captain Joseph J. Sullivan, U. S. Army Chaplain and former assistant pastor of the Pro-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart, has returned to Rochester from Ranchi, India, where he served with the Army Air Transport Command for the past 18 months.

He will report for reassignment to duty at the end of a 30-day furlough which he is currently spending with his mother, Mrs. John J. Sullivan, who resides at 60 Eden Street, Rochester.

While overseas Father Sullivan revealed that he flew across India to visit the Rev. Charles C. Young, a Holy Cross missionary and a former Rochesterian.

The missionary is a graduate of St. Mary's Boys Home, now St. Joseph's Villa, in Rochester, Chaplain Sullivan said.

To reach Father Young's missions, which are located in Bengal, famed wild animal country of India, Chaplain Sullivan had to travel many miles through the jungles. This entailed crossing numerous streams and many hours of walking on foot.

The last stage of the jungle trip was made in the darkness and Chaplain Sullivan revealed that he did not know about the danger of attack from tigers or lions until he had reached the safety of the mission ground.

Veterans Pick Father Pegnam

First diocesan priest to be named chaplain of a local World War II veterans group, the Rev. Francis J. Pegnam, assistant pastor of Holy Apostles Church, has been appointed to this post in the U. S. Global War Veterans local chapter by its commander, Anthony C. LaBar.

Formerly a U. S. Navy chaplain with the rank of lieutenant, senior grade, Father Pegnam was aboard the aircraft carrier "Bellevue Wood," a member of the famed Task Force 58, throughout some of the fiercest Pacific campaigns.

The Rochester priest received his honorable discharge on Dec. 16, 1945. He is assistant pastor, Holy Apostles Church, Rochester.

Fr. Whalen Meets Missioner From Diocese, in Hawaii

Auburn — How he helped the Marines on the Island of Maui in The Hawaii's to celebrate Christmas is told by Chaplain Leslie Whalen in a letter received here, this week.

Father Whalen also tells of meeting the Rev. Richard R. Brennan, S.S.C.C., whose home is in Rochester.

This was the third Christmas Chaplain Whalen has spent with the Marines.

Father Whalen, stationed on Maui, heard confessions at the Marine Supply Depot on Christmas Eve and offered Midnight Mass in his chapel. Another Mass was celebrated at 8 a. m. on the 11th and a third at St. Joseph's at Makawao on the 12th. In one of these Masses, he writes, parishioners of St. Mary's were remembered.

The Thursday before Christmas, Chaplain Whalen with the help of three other chaplains spent the entire day hearing confessions at St. Anthony High School, student enrollment, 1500. The Sunday before Christmas he celebrated Mass for the Marines and also for the children at the Maui Children's Home.

At the time the 4th Marines were stationed in Maui, the Sisters at St. Anthony's used to serve breakfast every Sunday

morning for 500 Marines.

Meets Bishop of Honolulu — Father Whalen tells of meeting His Excellency, Bishop Sweeney of Honolulu shortly after Christmas. The Bishop had gone to Maui to hold a clerical conference and for Confirmation.

The Rochester diocesan priest tells of being invited to a dinner at which twenty priests attended at St. Anthony's, in Wailuku. Of the twenty island priests, the only one who had not been ordained twenty years was Father Brennan of Rochester who went out there in October, this year.

Father Whalen said most of the priests in the Hawaiian Islands are Sacred Heart Fathers, the same community in charge of Our Lady of Victory Church, Rochester. The Diocese of Honolulu, he writes, has only three priests, the rest serving the diocese belong to the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary.
