

### Fr. Nolan Offers Mass At Mother's Rites

Auburn — Solemn Requiem Mass for Mrs. Agnes Nolan, widow of Michael Nolan, was offered by her son, the Rev. Raymond Nolan, principal of De Sales High School, Geneva, at St. Alphonsus Church, Monday, Jan. 28.

Mrs. Nolan, of 115 North Fulton St., died Wednesday, Jan. 23, 1946 at Mercy Hospital after a brief illness.

Keane for the repose of the soul of Reverend Mother Manuela Vicente, Superior General of the Society of the Sacred Heart. The Bishop was assisted by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. William M. Hart, V.G., Assistant Priest; Rev. Robert F. McNamara, Deacon; Chaplain John S. Whelan, Subdeacon; Rev. Edward M. Lyons and Rev. James C. Meaney, Deacons of Honor; Rev. John E. Maney, Master of Ceremonies.

The pupils of the Academy, friends and members of the Alumnae Association assisted at the Mass.

Reverend Mother Vicente's death took place Jan. 21, 1946, at the Mother House of the Society of the Sacred Heart in Rome. She had been Superior General since 1928, and during her time of office the work of the Society was extended by the foundation of twenty-four additional houses in Italy, Spain, France, Belgium, Germany, the British Isles, the United States, Canada, South America, India and the Belgian Congo.

Officiating at the Solemn Requiem Mass with Father Thomas Chapman were his two brothers, the Rev. William Chapman, C.S.S.R., of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church, E. 61st St., New York City, and the Rev. Francis Chapman, C.S.S.R., of the Missionary Band of St. Gerard, Lima, Ohio.

Interment was in the family plot, Holy Cross Cemetery, Brooklyn.

Mrs. Chapman died Sunday, Jan. 27, 1946 at her home, 623 59th St., Brooklyn, at the age of 78.

Born in Anagh, County Wexford, Ireland, the daughter of James Mulligan and Teresa Cavanagh, Mrs. Chapman came to Brooklyn in 1884. Nine years later she married the late John Chapman, a native of Kilmaleck, County Cavan, Ireland, in St. Augustine's Church, Brooklyn. Mr. Chapman died in 1916.

Rev. Thomas Chapman, who has been at St. Joseph's Church, Rochester about six weeks, formerly served as Archivist of the Military Ordinariate. The Rev. William Chapman is still attached to the Military Ordinariate as Secretary to Bishop William T. McCarty, C.S.S.R., D.D., Military Delegate.
