

Vatican Announces Consistory Schedule

Vatican City—(Radio-NC)—Joyous expectation is mounting in the Eternal City as the day approaches for the convocation of the Consistory and the ancient and solemn ceremonies signifying the creation of 22 new Cardinals from all continents of the earth.

35 in Cardinal Spellman's Party Flying to Rome

New York — A party of 35 clergy and laymen will accompany Archbishop Francis J. Spellman on his flight to Rome to receive his Cardinal's red hat. The plane will leave this city Monday.

Former Postmaster General James A. Farley heads the list of distinguished friends who will accompany the Cardinal-elect to Rome.

The complete list, announced by the Chancery Office of the New York Archdiocese, includes: Bishop John F. O'Hara of Buffalo, representing the bishops of the New York Province; Bishop William T. McCarty of the Military Ordinariate; Bishop Louis F. Kelleher of Boston. Representative Group

Rev. Robert L. Gannon, S.J., president of Fordham University; Msgr. Gaetano Arrese, representing the New York archdiocesan consultants; Msgr. Thomas J. McDonnell, national director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith; Msgr. Joseph A. McCaffery, representing the New York Archdiocesan Holy Name Society; Msgr. John J. Casey, representing the archdiocesan Societies and Women's Organizations; Msgr. Thomas J. McMahon, national secretary of the Near East Welfare Association.

The following classmates of Archbishop Spellman in the Vatican's North American College will also go with him to Rome: Bishop Gerald T. Bergan of Des Moines, Iowa; Msgr. Edward J. Quinn of Cincinnati, the Rev. Francis O. McCarthy of Chicago, the Rev. Joseph P. Christopher of Darlington, N. J., the Rev. Laurence B. Killian of Woburn, Mass., and the Rev. John J. Kelly of Hartford, Conn.

Pope to Announce New U. S. Bishops

Vatican City — (Radio, NC) — According to a report in Osservatore Romano His Holiness Pope Pius XII will make formal announcement at the consistory of recent changes in the American hierarchy. These changes, already announced in U. S. concern the appointment of Bishop William F. O'Connor of Superior as Ordinary of the newly-created Diocese of Madison, of Msgr. Charles F. Greco as Bishop of Alexandria, and Msgr. Thomas L. Nos as Coadjutor of Sioux City.

El Debate Out Again Madrid — (RNS) — Suppressed during the Civil War, the Spanish Catholic Action newspaper El Debate will shortly resume publication here under the direction of the Rev. Angel Hernandez.

After seven long years during which Rome, to a large extent, was cut off from the outside world, once again the ancient city becomes visibly the ecclesiastical center of the world. With the announcement that many of the already existing Cardinals from Italy, France and other countries will come to Rome and that 20 of the 22 Cardinal-designate are expected here, the forthcoming gathering of the Sacred College will be one of the largest in recent history. So large a gathering of Cardinals is rare except at the solemn conclave held for the election of a new Pope, which all Cardinals are obliged to attend.

In view of the exceptionally large number of new Cardinals to be formerly raised to the sacred purple, as well as the still limited facilities existing in the Italian capital, several minor changes in the traditional ceremonies have become necessary. The most important change is that the new Cardinals will receive the visits of diplomats and the official notification documents not individually in their residences but while assembled in groups at various ecclesiastical buildings.

The four new American Cardinals, for instance, will gather for these ceremonies in the Apostolic Chancery, one of the most beautiful Renaissance buildings of Europe, while the Cardinals from missionary countries will receive the diplomatic visitors at the Propaganda College.

Although some details still remain to be worked out, the general schedule of the forthcoming ceremonies will be as follows: February 12 Schedule

On Monday, February 12, the first Secret Consistory will be held in the Consistorial Hall, directly beneath the Pontifical apartment. At this meeting, the Holy Father will give his allocution and the actual creation of the new Cardinals takes place. Also on the agenda are announcements of the appointment of new Bishops and the creation of new dioceses, reports on canonization causes, and the postulation of the sacred Pallium for archiepiscopal and other privileged sees which have not received it so far.

Because of the fact that no Consistory has been held since 1940, many postulations of the Pallium — a white wool circular band to be worn by the Pope and Archbishops over the chasuble during certain ceremonies — will be made on this occasion.

On Tuesday, February 13, the so-called "visite di calore" will be made. Diplomats from various countries accredited to the Holy See, high-ranking members of the Roman Curia and Roman dig-

Card. Mooney Gets Titular Church of St. Susanna

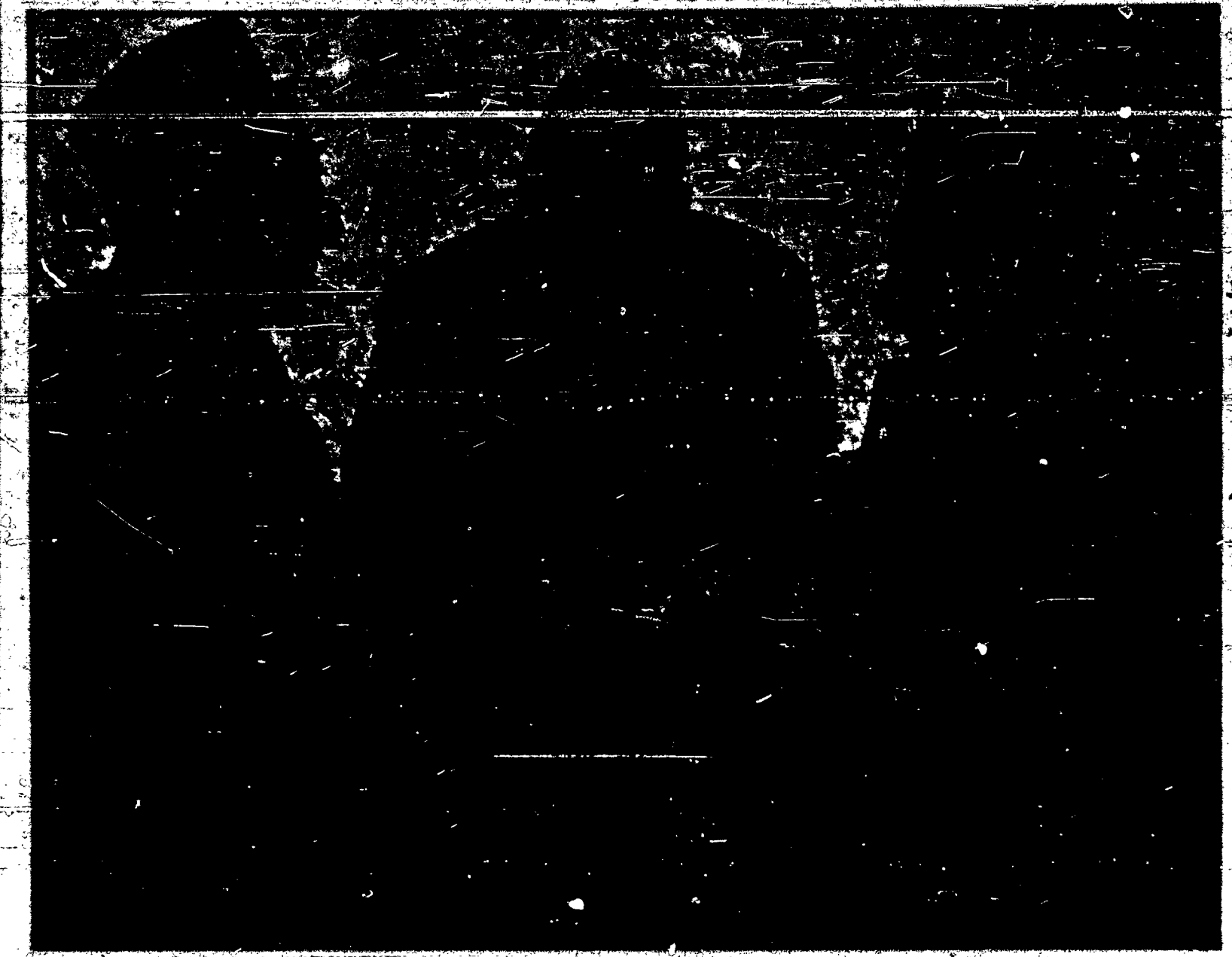

The Church of St. Agnes Outside the Walls will be assigned as the titular church in Rome of Cardinal-Designate Samuel A. Strick, Archbishop of Chicago. It is also made known.

It had previously been stated that Pope Pius XII has assigned his former titular church of Saints John and Paul to Cardinal-Designate Francis J. Spellman, of New York.

No information is available so far as to the titular church to be assigned Cardinal-Designate John J. Glennon, Archbishop of St. Louis.

Berlin — (NC) — Cardinal-designate Konrad von Freyburg, Bishop of Berlin, left here this week aboard a French airplane for Paris en route to Rome.

The other two German Cardinals-elect, Joseph Frings, Arch-

bishop of Cologne, and Clement August von Galen, Bishop of Muenster, will journey to Rome within a few days. Cardinal Michael von Faulhaber, Archbishop of Munich and Freyburg, the only present German Cardinal, plans

to travel to Rome by automobile via Switzerland.

Mather Cabrini's Cause is Listed

ST. LOUIS, Feb. 7 (AP) —

Vatican City — (NC Radio) — Four, and possibly other, causes of canonization will be discussed at the coming Consistories, at which the newly named Cardinals-designate will be formally elevated to the Sacred College of Cardinals.

It also was stressed that present conditions in Rome and throughout Italy offer insufficient facilities for travel and lodging the vast numbers of pilgrims who normally attend the functions of solemn canonizations.

The causes which will be discussed are Blessed Elizabeth Naylor of Agon, co-founder of

the French Order of Daughters of the Cross; Blessed Juan de Brito, S. J., the Portuguese who was martyred in India in 1683; Blessed Bernardino Realino, famous Italian Jesuit preacher, who died in 1614, and Blessed Mother Frances Xavier Cabrini, the Italian-born foundress of the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart, who carried on her work in the United States and died there.

Sapientia, Archbishop of Cracow, Poland, Joseph Mindszenty, Archbishop of Esztergom, Hungary, Konrad von Freyburg, Bishop of Berlin, and Clement August von Galen, Bishop of Muenster. Cardinal-designate Teodoro Clemente de Gouveia, Archbishop of Lourenco Marques, Mozambique, Africa, who arrived in Rome by airplane from Cairo, Egypt, explained that his delay on route was due to a forced stop at Khartoum, Egypt, by a six-day quarantine.
