

Evening Masses in Paris Planned for Workers  
Paris — (AP) — Plans for evening Masses to accommodate workers who cannot get to church in the morning are being

discussed by Catholic authorities here. The Masses will probably start at seven o'clock, and those who wish to receive Communion will be given a special dispensation requiring them to fast only for four hours previously.

### SCHOLARSHIP EXAM SET BY COLLEGE

The annual competitive examination for scholarships to Good Counsel College, White Plains, N. Y., will be held Saturday, Mar. 23, from 1 to 4 p. m. at the College.

These scholarships which are offered to girls graduating from approved high schools in June, 1946, are awarded on the basis of a comprehensive examination in English, a psychological examination and the High School record and recommendation of the principal.

### Mgr. Sheen Reminds Club Of Pope's A-Bomb Warning

New York — (NC) — Msgr. Fulton J. Sheen, of the Catholic University of America, speaking at a Communion breakfast of the New York Province of the Newman Club Federation here, told his collegiate audience that the Holy Father had deplored the use of atomic energy as a destructive force three years ago.

Msgr. Sheen told the gathering that His Holiness Pope Pius XII, in addressing the Pontifical Academy of Science in February, 1943, had asked that atomic energy never be used for destruction, "for if so used there will result a terrible catastrophe in the entire planet."

"Whenever men cease to fear God they begin to fear the cruelty of their fellow men," Msgr. Sheen declared. "When

man broke with God the atomic bomb fell. Now we say it should be controlled, but as we talk peace our government plans to use it destructively.

"Can it be that the destructive use of atomic energy is the last stage of the mechanization of man?" he asked, remarking that the atomic "age" may be only an atomic "moment."
