You're healthy, you eat the food you should eat, and you get in at least the minimum requirement of shut-eye every night. There's a certain attractiveness that comes automatically of cleanliness, so that's an excellent place to begin your campaign. Clean hair, clean teeth, and clean, well manicured hands are basic requirements. And no mat-
