Corning Coast Guard Baton Expert Granted Discharge

Corning — Alex Kosty, son of Mrs. Mary Kosty, 174 E. Market St., recently discharged from the U. S. Coast Guard as Musician 1/c, made an enviable place for himself as a baton twirler while in the service.

The talented young man showed his ability, acquired through association with the St. Patrick's Cadets and the Corning Free Academy band, at the very outset of his service when he enlisted in January, 1943. Sent to Manhattan Beach Training Station it was not long before he became major of the training station drum and bugle corps. Later young Kosty became a

member of the Manhattan Beach U. S. Coast Guard Military Band which performed more than 1,000 times from January 1944 until December 1945. Notable among its appearances were those at the Admiral Nimitz Day parade in New York City; at the Stage Door Canteen where it was co-starred with Tommy Tucker's Band; at the AWVS rally at the Waldorf-Astoria at which Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt was guest of honor; at the annual religious service of the Archdiocesan Union of the Holy Name Society at the Polo Grounds, New York City, where Cardinal-designate Francis J. Spellman was among the spectators and at many important War Bond rallies. Each time Musician Kosty was featured in his outstanding act. Now at home with his mother, "Al" hopes to enter college under the GI Bill of Rights.
