Swiss Missioners Arrive To Study English in U. S.
 Erie, Pa. — (NC) — Four missionary priests of the Society of Bethlehem have arrived here from Innsbruck, Austria, Switzerland, to enroll at Loras College, where they will study English in preparation for future Catholic missionary work in the Orient.

 The first converts of the first ages of Faith were in no position to fully appreciate how practical it was the Church was even from the start. It was not possible for them to foresee how incomparably superior in the centuries ahead the Faith would be over the ways of the world.
 This is the valuable advantage of Catholics in the present hour. We can now enjoy the thrill of reading the Church's record and seeing how many times the wisdom of the Faith has been vindicated over the fads and fancies of the modern age.

to see, if not the first, that birth control despite all the liberal propaganda of its apostles, is actually an attack against birth itself.
 Birth control promoters have been active for only a few years and already even the opponents of the Church are frankly admitting that if a child ever sees the light of day it will probably be within a Catholic home.
 Over in once Merry England statisticians are seriously disturbed about the population. If the current British birthrate is maintained, no current statistics indicate, then somewhere around the year 2,000 there will be no Englishmen left anywhere.

Like many others, of course, we Catholics have lost any confidence we may have had in the much vaunted might of man, particularly Modern Man. As Catholics alone, however, we are enjoying the unusual experience of finding ourselves converted anew to the Faith with the dawn of each new day.
 There have been a dozen times in the last ten years, if not the last ten minutes, when every Catholic could say: "If I were not already a Catholic, I would have joined the Church."

"There will always be an England!" This is a proud song of the brave little island but we might feel more confident if we could only hear a few more children's voices join in the chorus.
 In the United States the story of birth control has the same dismal details. Statisticians have just revealed that "the country's best educated women" — the college graduates — are having 46 per cent fewer children than are needed to keep their class in society as large as it is now.
 Even our women with high school education are falling by 21 per cent to hold their own in our national life.

So, it is now very clear that when the Church resisted the first attempt to break a marriage by divorce she was resisting an attack on all marriages.
 Today, the widespread scandal of divorce is inspiring through the veins of society and is dissipating the energies of modern life. The family — the real strength of any nation — is suffering longingly from the insidiousness of divorce.

Maybe an atomic bomb will get us all before it really happens but the continuance of birth control practices in this country forecasts a nation of old people.
 In view of this grim possibility, the Church — despite her age — emerges as something very young because today she stands alone as the champion of the little ones — as the Church of the future.

This dangerous situation is now recognized by worried social Moderns, but the Divine Censorship from the first hour of her life forever our present plight and warned that divorce was only a step towards social chaos.
 A few centuries ago the Church opposed a lustful English monarch who wanted a divorce from his wife. The king's people at the time may have failed to see the importance of the issue. Now it is clear that the Church's fight against Henry VIII was in reality a brave effort to save the home of every Englishman as long as there are Englishmen. The Pope's contest with the King was a fight to save the marriage of every tradesman, every storekeeper and every mechanic who would ever take unto himself a wife.

There are only two of the many features of modern life that make present-day Catholics feel as if they are converts. We are seeing the Catholic Faith not only approved by God but vindicated also by the bitter experience of man.
 The Church gives us, in Catholicism, the promise of an eternal reward, but how we are made clearly than ever that besides saving souls the Church can also save the home, the marriage and the child.
 To save a place for themselves in Heaven, men continuously through the centuries have joined the Church. Now they are discovering something else — only within the Church can they save ANYTHING for themselves ON EARTH.

Another striking instance of how the events of our times only confirm the imperishable wisdom of the Church is seen in the modern doctrine of birth control.
 The evil doctrine, better characterized as "race suicide," was first published to the public in an organized fashion about 25 years ago. In condemning this practice the Church had many enemies, particularly the prohibition of God's law.
 But the Church was not alone.
