### Silver Star Presented New York Army Chaplain

New York (NC) — The Rev. Herman L. Heide, Army chaplain from the New York archdiocese, was presented the Silver Star Medal at a military ceremony at Fort Slocum near here. He had been awarded the medal for gallantry in France. Father Heide led medical corpsmen and litter bearers to rescue the wounded in the thick of a heavy German assault. After ministering to the wounded all day, he was captured by the Germans and spent months in a POW camp.
