The Rochester Diocesan Council of Catholic Women, and its affiliates will have official representation at the 1946 N.C.C.W. Convention in Kansas City, Missouri.

At the invitation of the Most Rev. Lewis V. O'Hara, D.D., Bishop of Kansas City and the Kansas City Diocesan Council of Catholic Women, the N.C.C.W. will convene there September 21-25, 1946. Convention headquarters will be at the Hotel McNichols, Kansas City.

Inspired by the stirring plea of His Holiness, Pope Pius XII, in his address on "Women's Duties in Social and Political Life,"

the convention has taken as a theme the title of the Pontiff's speech.

The convention will bring together a nationwide representation from the Diocesan and State Councils and National organizations of Catholic women, for earnest deliberation upon the current issues facing women.

Picture Parade

RKO PALACE
"MY REPUTATION" (Adults) Warners' On the trusty theme that one who fleeces another's good name does worse than rob his purse, Catherine Turney has fashioned from Clare Jaynes' novel "Instruct My Sorrows," a starring piece for Barbara Stanwyck and George Brent. Miss Stanwyck's delineation of a well-bred young widow, who supposedly "married to a lovely memory" suddenly engages in a dubious romance with a plump, philandering and middle-aged Major Scott Landis (Brent), is marred by frequent lapses into ill-forged spells of adolescent coquetry. The Major has "never believed marriage to be for me," but she accepts romance on his terms. Result: her two boys hear her name scandalized and are shocked. When they go to her, instead of telling them lovingly that people have wronged her, she treats them coldly and behaves like a selfish Hollywood movie queen freshly engaged in justifying her latest amour.

The main weakness throughout lies in conventional Hollywood treatment of marriage; upon an attendant inability to comprehend the true meaning of "living with a lovely memory," and an apparent incapacity on the part of movie writers to distinguish between fair standards of social behavior and an over-caricatured code of social severity.
