Scranton, Pa. — Eight scholarships to Marywood College, Scranton, Pa., are being offered by the college administration in the 1946-47 program of awards deserving high school graduates. Two full tuition scholarships valued at \$300 each per year, two partial tuition scholarships of \$150 each per year, and \$100 each per year will be given.

Arrangements may be made to hold examinations in other centers besides Scranton. If the number of applicants warrants it.
