Pvt. Samuel Edmons, veteran of 2 1/2 years service. He was a member of the AAA, Coast

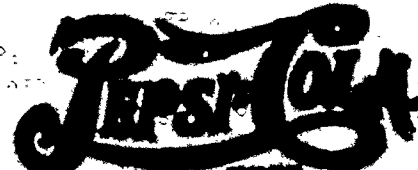
Guard Artillery and saw service in New Guinea and Luzon.
