

CDA to Observe 20th Anniversary Of Junior Groups

Two decades of a religious, educational, charitable and recreational program for Catholic girls, which had its origin in New York on Feb. 22, 1926, will be observed by Senior and Junior Catholic Daughters of America in a nation-wide program beginning Feb. 22 and continuing until Feb. 24.

First scheduled event for the twentieth anniversary observance, according to Miss Beatrice M. Hoffman, Mount Kisco, New York, National Junior Director, will be the anniversary Mass of thanksgiving and corporate Communion on Sunday, Feb. 18.

As the birthday anniversary gift, a spiritual bouquet will be presented to the Holy Father through the office of the Apostolic Delegate, the Most Rev. Angelo Giovanni Cognigni. This will be the 4th annual Spiritual Bouquet to be sent to the Pontiff.

In 30 Dioceses

The Senior Junior program, according to Miss Mary C. Duffy, Supreme Regent of the Catholic Daughters, was authorized by the national officers and directors twenty years ago, to meet the need of that day for a Catholic youth guidance program. In the intervening years the program has been extended into 30 dioceses with episcopal approval and is organized in 31 states and in Puerto Rico.

The records of Junior activi-

ties over the period of twenty years indicate, Miss Hoffman states, that the Junior standards — to love God, to serve others, to live nobly — and the Junior's motto — be useful — are taken seriously.

In the twenty years more than \$200,000 has been contributed by the Juniors to Home and Foreign Missions and other charitable programs — exclusive of the personal services rendered.

The spiritual growth, however, she believes from personal contacts and from reports, is unsurpassed by any other youth group, noting particularly the increase of Masses heard, Holy Communion received, special prayers and devotions, which form the annual Spiritual Bouquet for the Holy Father.

Bishop William J. Harty of Scranton, and National Chaplain for the Catholic Daughters of America is Episcopal Chairman for the National Junior Department, and Reverend Robert Brown, Associate Director of the Catholic Youth Organization of the Archdiocese of New York, is National Junior Chaplain.

The Rochester Diocesan Council, National Council of Catholic Women, and its affiliates will have official representation at the 1946 N.C.C.W. Convention in Kansas City, Missouri. At the invitation of the Most Rev. Edwin V. O'Hara, D.D., Bishop of Kansas City and the Kansas City Diocesan Council of Catholic Women, the N.C.C.W. will convene there September 21-25, 1946. Convention headquarters will be at the Hotel Muehlebach, Kansas City.

Inspired by the stirring plea of His Holiness, Pope Pius XII, in his address on "Women's Duties in Social and Political Life," the convention has taken as a theme the title of the Pontiff's speech.

The convention will bring together a nation-wide representation from the Diocesan and State Councils and National organizations of Catholic women, for earnest deliberation upon the current issues facing women.

Teacher Leaves Estate To Catholic Education

St. Louis — (NC) — The late Miss Mary E. Calname, public school teacher, has willed \$14,000 in special bequests to Catholic institutions and the bulk of her estate to St. Louis University to provide scholarships.

Bequests include \$10,000 to St. Stanislaus Novitiate of Florence, Mo., for the education of students in the Jesuit Society; \$2,000 to the St. Louis University Library, and \$1,000 each to the Convent of the Good Shepherd here and the Deaf Mute Institute.

8 Scholarship Exams Listed by Marywood

Scranton, Pa. — Eight scholarships to Marywood College, Scranton, Pa., are being offered by the college administration in the 1946-47 program of awards to deserving high school graduates. Two full tuition scholarships valued at \$300 each per year, two partial tuition scholarships of \$200 each per year, and four of \$100 each per year will be given.

Awards will be made on the basis of competitive examinations to be held at the college on Saturday, March 2, as well as on the basis of the applicant's high school record and the principal's recommendation.

The scholarships are open to representative young women in the upper fifth of their class who fulfill the entrance requirements of the college. The examinations to be given March 2 include a psychological examination and comprehensive tests in English and in American History. Arrangements may be made to hold examinations in other centers besides Scranton, if the number of applicants warrants it.

Registration should be completed before the final date of February 22. Application blanks may be secured from the Scholarship Committee at Marywood College, Scranton 9, Pa.
