

Funeral of Father Sherry Held in Canandaigua

Funeral services for the Rev. Walter B. Sherry, Ph.D., 49, who died Sunday, Feb. 10, 1946 in St. Mary's Hospital, were conducted this morning (Thursday, Feb. 14, 1946) at St. Mary's Church, Canandaigua.

Pastor of St. Joseph's Church, Harvard, New York, Father Sherry had been living with his father, John J. Sherry, 29 Perry Pl., Canandaigua, prior to going to the hospital.

His Excellency, Bishop James E. Kearney offered the Requiem Mass. Friends of the diocese chartered the office of the dead Wednesday night. Burial was in

Born in Canandaigua the son of John J. and the late Anna Dorsey Sherry, Father Sherry attended St. Mary's Parochial school, Canandaigua, and the Canandaigua Academy before entering St. Andrew's Seminary, Rochester. He was president of the seminary's 1926 class.

He later attended St. Bernard's Seminary, Rochester, Belmont Abbey Seminary and College, Belmont, N. C., and St. Paul's Seminary, St. Paul, Minn.

Ordained to the priesthood June 2, 1934, by the Most Rev. John Gregory Murray, Archbishop of St. Paul, he celebrated his first low Mass at the seminary chapel the following day. First solemn Mass was offered in St. Mary's Church June 10, 1934.

Besides his father, the priest leaves one sister, Mrs. Catherine Christoph, of Canandaigua; four brothers, John P. and Bernard M. Sherry, Canandaigua, Joseph M. Sherry, Rochester, Paul F. Sherry, Geneva; two nephews, John J. Sherry, U. S. Army, and Francis E. Sherry, Canandaigua, and two nieces, Carol Ann and Paula Lee Sherry of Geneva.

The Rochester Diocesan Council, National Council of Catholic Women, and its affiliates will have official representation at the 1946 N.C.C.W. Convention in Kansas City, Missouri.

At the invitation of the Most Rev. Edwin V. O'Hara, D.D., Bishop of Kansas City and the Kansas City Diocesan Council of Catholic Women, the N.C.C.W. will convene there September 21-25, 1946. Convention headquarters will be at the Hotel Muehlebach, Kansas City.

Inspired by the stirring plea of His Holiness, Pope Pius XII, in his address on "Women's Duties in Social and Political Life," the convention has taken as a theme the life of the Pontiff's speech.

The convention will bring together a nation-wide representation from the Diocesan and State Councils and National organizations of Catholic women, for earnest deliberation upon the current issues facing women.

8 Scholarship Exams Listed by Marywood

Scranton, Pa. — Eight scholarships to Marywood College, Scranton, Pa., are being offered by the college administration in the 1946-47 program of awards to deserving high school graduates. Two full tuition scholarships valued at \$300 each per year; two partial tuition scholarships of \$100 each per year; and four of \$100 each per year will be given.

Awards will be made on the basis of competitive examinations to be held at the college on Saturday, March 2, as well as on the basis of the applicant's high school record and the principal's recommendations.

The scholarships are open to representative young women in the upper fifth of their class who fulfill the entrance requirements of the college. The examinations to be given March 2 include a psychological examination and comprehensive tests in English and in American History. Arrangements may be made to hold examinations in other centers besides Scranton, if the number of applicants warrants it.

Registration should be completed before the final date of February 23. Application blanks may be secured from the Scholarship Committee at Marywood College, Scranton, Pa.

3 Cardinals-Elect Attend K. of C. Dinner in New York

Among notables attending the golden jubilee dinner of New York State Council of the Knights of Columbus, Saturday evening, in the Hotel Astor, New York City, was His Excellency Bishop James E. Kearney of Rochester.

Highlight of the occasion was an address by Archbishop Francis J. Spellman who addressed the 1,500 guests on the eve of his departure to Rome where he will be raised to the cardinalate.

The Cardinal-elect referred somberly to the gloomy pall that is cast over every nation. Look where you will, he demanded, look "to the East, West, North and South — nothing so much like the fulfillment of the prophetic pronouncement of the Apocalypse has ever before been witnessed."

"War, death, famine and pestilence stalk the earth," he added, "and the atomic age is ushered in by the annihilation of the cities of Hiroshima and Nagasaki,

and in each instance an estimated hundred thousand lives were extinguished in a second of time.
