 priests and people I receive most favorable comment on the news and editorial content of our diocesan weekly," the Bishop stated. "I am sure that those who are giving their talents to the production of the COURIER-JOURNAL will find the best encouragement for their efforts in a renewed and increased subscription list for our paper."

With the approval of the Board of Directors, subscription rates of the COURIER-JOURNAL will be increased beginning April 1, the Rev. John S. Randall, managing editor, has announced.

Starting with the first issue of April, single copies will be 6 cents; a year's subscription during this month of March, which is annual subscription month, will be \$1.75; during other months, the annual subscription will be \$2.50.

The increase in rates is necessary, Father Randall explained, in order to meet the increase in cost of the paper's operation. "During the past year," he said, "we have made additions to our staff, introduced mechanical improvements, and increased our news resources. These forward steps have increased costs, but are all necessary in order to maintain the steady progress of the COURIER-JOURNAL."

Parish Subscriptions

Subscriptions to the official diocesan weekly are now being solicited through the pastors of each parish. According to a plan adopted two years ago, each parish is asked to guarantee a percentage of subscribers which will represent the major portion of its enrolled families.

"During the war years," Father Randall pointed out, "we did not attempt any substantial increase in circulation because of paper restrictions. Now that paper restrictions have been lifted," he added, "we sincerely hope that every parish will aim at a 100% coverage of all its families." New subscriptions received during this month will start with the first issue of April.

 From 321 priests of the diocese came \$96,045 while 28 special pledges totaling \$10,815 were received to account for the full total.

A record crowd of 3,000 campaigners jammed the Rochester Chamber of Commerce last Friday to attend the final report dinner and hear the Rt. Rev. Msgr. William M. Hart, V.G., announce the grand total.
