

### Fr. Cleary to Give Lenten Sermons at Old St. Mary's

The Rev. Donald M. Cleary, Catholic chaplain at Cornell University will deliver the 5:30 p. m. Wednesday sermons in Old St. Mary's Church, Washington Park, during Lent, it is announced today by the Rev. Dr. George F. Kettell, pastor.

Lenten services will be conducted every Wednesday afternoon at 5:30 p. m. and will consist of Rosary, Sermon and Benediction.

A former Army Chaplain, Father Cleary was a Captain in the U. S. Army Air Forces and served in the European theater. He will give a series of meditations on "The Return From Calvary." Topics for each Wednesday's meditation are:

- Ash Wednesday, March 6—"The Road"
- March 13—"The Road and Parents"
- March 20—"The Road and Mentors"
- March 27—"The Road and Doctors and Lawyers"
- April 3—"The Road and Business and Labor"
- April 10—"The Road and I"

Stations of the Cross will be conducted each Friday evening at Old St. Mary's beginning at 5:30 p. m. Noonday Mass will be celebrated every day of Lent at 12:15 p. m. (noon) and there will be instructions on "The Parables of Christ." Confessions will be heard every day except Sunday from 5:30 to 6 p. m.

Ashes will be distributed on Ash Wednesday after the 8 a. m. Mass; after the 12:15 p. m. Mass and after the 5:30 p. m. services.

Other Lenten daily Masses will be at 7 and 8 a. m. Sunday Masses will be at 7, 8, 9:30, 10:15, 10:30, 11, 11:30 and 12:15.
