

Japanese Catholic Paper Reappears

Tokyo — (NC) — Coming back to life amid Tokyo's ashes the Catholic weekly newspaper *Kayotoku Shinbun* has resumed publication ten months after its office and printing plant were destroyed in an air raid.

The first post-war issue of the paper, which reaches readers during the month which is commemorated as Catholic Press Month and also the feast of the Japanese Martyrs, has four pages, tabloid size. Eight thousand copies were printed.

The lead story on page one — which, incidentally, is the back page in Japanese style — reports the establishment of a national central office modeled after the National Catholic Welfare Conference in the United States.

From a ten-month backlog of Catholic news, the *Kayotoku Shinbun* editor, Father Joseph Fukahori, chose for his other stories: the Pope's 1945 Christmas message to the world; the

new freedom for religious organizations in Japan; details of the Nagasaki atomic holocaust; the assassination last August of Bishop-elect Toda of Yokohama; and the recent ordinations of Japanese priests in Rome.

Q.—A widow of a man killed in action states that she may soon re-marry and she wonders if she will lose her widow's pension?

A.—Yes, for the law states that the pension granted to the wife of a man killed in action will be in force for life, unless she re-marries.

Q.—Another wife writes that her husband will be discharged from the Army in a few weeks and they wish to live and work on a small farm they own. However, many repairs are required and they wish to buy some livestock. She asks how they go about getting a loan from the government under the G.I. Bill?

A.—The cash must be borrowed from a bank, other lending institution or an individual. The government, through the Veterans Administration will guarantee part of an approved loan. The VA guarantees 50% of such loans up to \$4000. In other words, on a loan for \$8000, or less, the government will guarantee 50% of the loan; on loans over \$4000, the government may not guarantee more than \$2000 of the amount borrowed.

Q.—A veteran who was discharged 8 months ago states that his doctor tells him that he should be operated on for appendicitis. He asks if he can obtain free medical care and hospitalization at a Veterans Administration as a veteran?

A.—As your condition is not service connected, you may only obtain medical attention and hospitalization, if you have not the funds to pay for private care. We have mailed you the proper VA forms for filing for such care.

Q.—This veteran asks if he can buy a surplus property car from the Smaller War Plans Corp. for his private use?

A.—No, all surplus property purchased must be for business use. Cars may be had for the use of a salesman, for example, who must have one for his business. At present we understand your chance of getting a surplus car is about one in 10,000. Thousands who have applied will never get one of these surplus cars for this car single has been highly overrated in the press and the conditions of the cars is questionable, they are bought "as is" and many have not been reconditioned.

Q.—Can a veteran over 25 years at the time of his induction receive any education under the G.I. Bill?

A.—Yes, he is eligible for one year and if he can prove that his education was interrupted by his induction, he is entitled to additional time. We have mailed you a booklet on the educational features of both the G.I. Bill and Public Law 16.
