

Thief Profanes Seville Church

Madrid — (RNS) — An unidentified individual broke into the Church of San Roque in Seville, stole a valuable crown decorating a statue of the Virgin, and took the elphorium from the tab-

ernacle of the high altar, scattering the sacred Hosts on the altar steps.

The theft caused a sensation throughout the city. Catholic Action leaders and students of Seville University immediately organized an act of public reparation. Then Cardinal Archbishop Peter Segura Y Saenz issued a pastoral letter denouncing the sacrilege.

Arctic Oblate Missioners To Have Own Supply Plane

Montreal — Their own plane service to bring supplies to the Arctic mission stations will be inaugurated next month by the Oblate Fathers, the Rev. Etienne Bazin, O.M.I., who was marooned in the Far North for the past two years, disclosed here as he stopped on route to his home in Dijon, France.

The Rev. A. A. Carlier, O.M.I., will be at the controls when the Oblates' plane makes its first relief flight. So far it has been considered impracticable to aid the isolated missionaries in the Arctic by air because of lack of refueling arrangements for the return trip. However, a Hudson's Bay plane did reach Repulse Bay; it was on this plane that Father Bazin came back to civilization.

Father Bazin, who was in charge of the Repulse Bay mission post, gave a first-hand account of the experiences of the Oblate Fathers who were cut off from their ordinary supplies due to the wrecking of the mission boat "M. F. Thérèse" in 1944 and the failure of the Hudson's Bay supply boat to get through the ice last fall.

He said that the priests from the missions "closest" to him, the Revs. Theophile Diller and Julien Cochard, of Igloodik, 240 miles to the north, and the Rev. Pierre Henry, of Polly Bay, 210 miles away, had assembled with him at Repulse Bay in order to pool their resources and make them stretch as far as possible.

The four priests closed off a small portion of the chapel and kept it heated with what gasoline they had left. The gasoline is now gone, and the three priests who remained in the Arctic have turned to the Eskimo methods of keeping warm, burning seal grease and moss in a hollowed stone.

Father Bazin described how the Oblate missionaries traveled about their vast territories, by dog sled, going from one igloo village to the next, and always traveling with an Eskimo guide whose uncanny sense of direction could be relied upon in the wide open spaces, even in an Arctic snow storm.

He said that an Eskimo or even a missionary could build an igloo in three-quarters of an hour, by cutting out blocks of the hard-packed snow, these being long by one and a half feet wide by six inches thick. Each of Repulse Bay's missionaries, he said, cut with a big knife, the snow

it is harder and must be sawed. Asked where the missionaries stayed while on a tour of their stations, Father Bazin said that when he was spending only a day or two at a station, he made his home with an Eskimo family in their igloo, but if he was staying for several weeks he made his own igloo, with the eager assistance of the Eskimos.

Maryland College Offers Scholarships

Emmitsburg, Md. — Competitive examinations for full and partial scholarships to Saint Joseph's College, here, (conducted by Sisters of Charity) will be given at convenient centers throughout the country on Saturday, March 19. Application for scholarship blanks may be obtained by writing to the Registrar at the College.

With the returned application, the scholastic record for three and a half years of high school and the list of subjects to be completed during the last semester must be included. Records and application must reach the College before March 4.

Full scholarships, valued at \$3,000 include board, room, and tuition for four years, while partial scholarships valued at \$1,200 include tuition and room for the four years. These awards will be made after the competitive examination on basis of character, ability, and scholastic excellence. The examination will cover secondary school content. Winners will be announced about April 1.

Saint Joseph's College is conducted by the Daughters of Charity of Saint Vincent de Paul, and offers a four year course leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science. It prepares students for entrance in the following fields: Classical, Science, Social Science, Technology, Dietetics, Home Economics, Secretarial Science, Teaching and Journalism, pre-medical and pre-nursing courses are also offered.

Among Religious the Jesuits led with 33 arrests, the Benedictines had 21, the Redemptorists 16, and the Cisterians 15.

Publication of these arrests has greatly chagrined certain elements of religion because they were trying to put all priests and Religious among the "Blacks," a name given to those who collaborated with the Nazis in any way.
