

Veterans Unit Names Candaigua Chaplain

Rev. Vincent A. Beyma, a captain in the U. S. Army Chaplain Corps and priest of Scranton diocese, has been assigned as chaplain to the Veterans' Hospital, Candaigua. Father Beyma who served thirty months overseas will conclude his terminal leave on March 3.

In his new assignment the former Army Chaplain is serving in the Chaplain Corps of the Veterans Administration under the jurisdiction of the Military Ordinariate headed by His Eminence, Cardinal Spellman.

Chaplain Beyma was discharged from the U. S. Army at Fort Dix, N. J., with 98 points and is retaining his commission in the Officers Reserve Corps.

Served As Pastor

Prior to entering the Army, Father Beyma was pastor of St. Joseph's Church, South Plitaston, Pa. He entered active duty on Oct. 1, 1942, and reported to the Chaplain School at Harvard University.

Overseas where he went on July 17, 1943, he served nine months with the 5th General Hospital in England and later with the 32nd Armored Regiment of the 3rd Armored Division. The Chaplain participated in these five battle campaigns: Normandy, Northern France, the Rhine land, Ardennes and Central Germany.

Scheduled for Pacific service with the 51st Ordnance Group of the 1st Army on VE day, he reached La Harve, France, for embarkation when VE day was announced. He finished his service in the European Theater at Bremen, Germany, returning to the U. S. on Nov. 22, 1945, landing at Hampton Roads, Va.

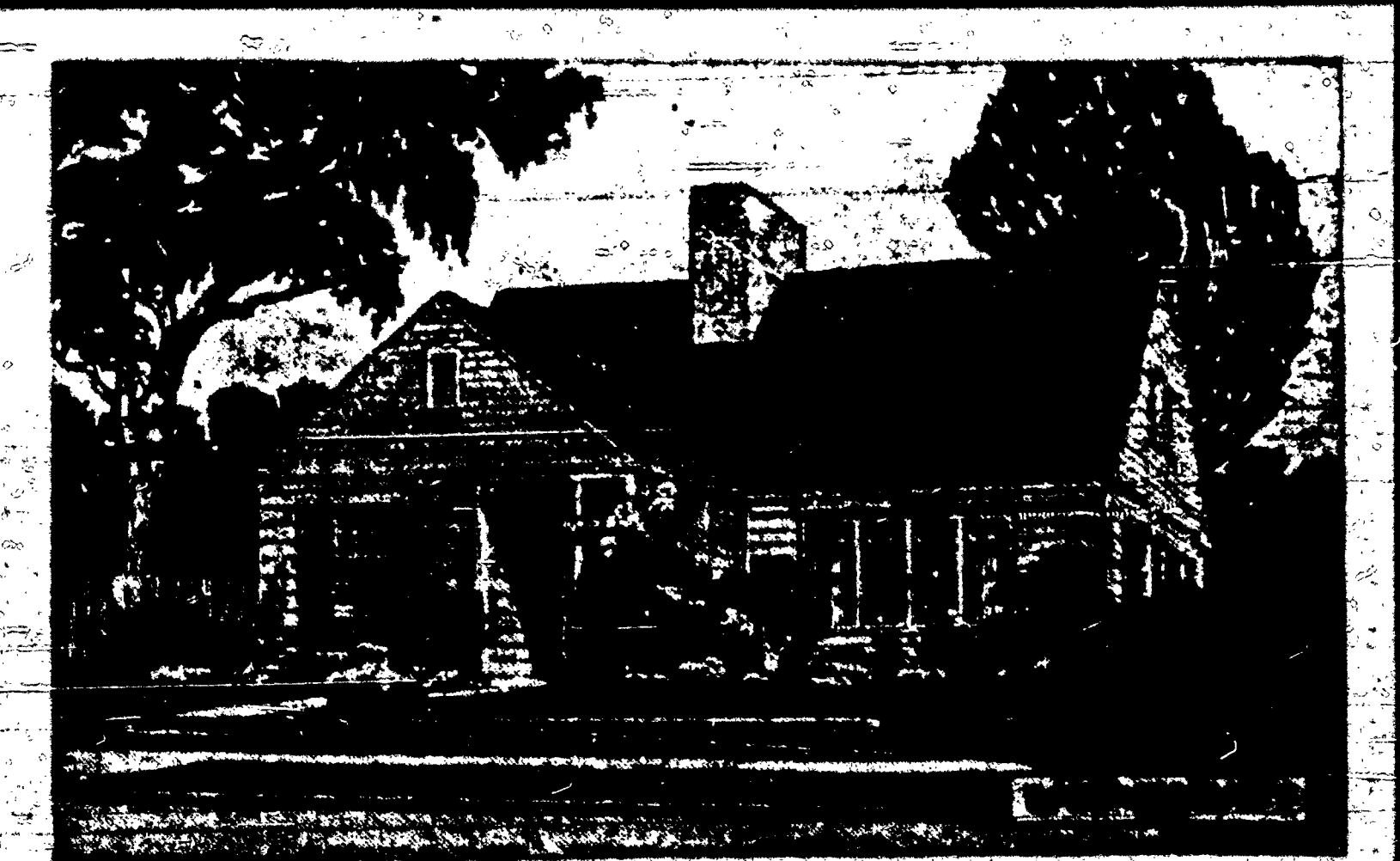
