New Jersey College Offers Scholarships

Four scholarships valued at
\$500.00 are open to freshmen
enrolling at the College of St.
Elizabeth for September, 1946.
The Sister Mary Pauline Schol-
arship offers an annual grant of
\$250.00; The Sister Regina Clare
Scholarship, an annual grant of
\$500.00. Two additional schol-
arships each awarding \$250.00 an-
nually to the holders are also
offered.

These scholarships are open
to Catholic high school girls and
Catholic girls in public high
schools who are eligible to com-
pete for them through the Col-
lege Entrance Board Examina-
tion to be held in Rochester
April 6, 1946.

To be eligible to compete, the
applicant must:

1. Offer the fifteen units of
high school credit required for
admission.
2. Rank in the highest quar-
ter of her class.
3. Be recommended by the
principal of her high school as

qualified for college work.

Application blanks will be
mailed. Address: College of St.
Elizabeth, Convent Station, New
Jersey.

With the application must be
submitted a transcript of the
applicant's high school record in-
dicating her rank in the class
together with a letter of recom-
mendation from her principal.
This information must be in the
hands of the Committee on
Scholarships not later than
March 1, 1946.

Volunteers for Gray Lady Corps Wanted

The Gray Lady Corps of Roch-
ester Chapter, American Red
Cross, are doing an invaluable
job in the Veterans' Administra-
tion Hospital at Canandaigua, ac-
cording to Mrs. Agnes Schults,
Red Cross Field Director at the
hospital.

To the newly arrived patients
they bring a continuation of the
Red Cross service and friend-
liness which the men had come to
rely on in Army and Navy hos-
pitals at home and overseas. To
the older patients they are long-
valued visitors, symbols of the
country's unforgetting friendli-
ness.

To keep up this unforgetting
friendliness, Rochester Chapter
needs many more volunteers be-
tween the ages of 25-45, U. S.
citizens, who are willing to take
a three-weeks' training course,
meeting three days a week at the
Veterans Administration Hospi-
tal in Canandaigua. The Red
Cross Motor Corps will take the
volunteers down and back. The
volunteers must work at least
one day a week at the hospital.
(Motor Corps transportation will
be provided).

Relief Services Name Director for Czechs

New York — The appointment
of William J. Sullivan, of Cliff-
side Park, N. J., as resident di-
rector in Czechoslovakia has been
announced by War Relief Ser-
vices-National Catholic Welfare
Conference. He will journey by
plane to Prague shortly to com-
plete arrangements for the dis-
tribution of supplies throughout
Czechoslovakia.

Mr. Sullivan only recently re-
turned from Europe where he
served with the Army Exchange
Services of the Army Service
Forces, War Relief Services-N.
C.W.C., following its established
pattern, will work in Czechoslov-
akia through Caritas, through
which the facilities of hospitals,
orphanages, day nurseries and
dispensaries are made available.
The program will be directed
primarily toward the care of chil-
dren, the aged and infirm.
