

Government Allowances To Large Families Urged

Washington, D.C. — (RNS) — Thomas Lally, a student at Loyola College, Baltimore, Md., told the youth session of the 14th annual National Catholic Conference on Family Life at Catholic University of America here, that Government should give financial allowances to parents of large families.

The student pointed out that large families are either not welcome under certain housing conditions or find it difficult to oc-

cupy economically those places open to them. He declared it is the duty of the state to aid large families by helping them financially, when necessary.

Lally also advocated wage aids by the State so that large family groups could be maintained properly. He said that practically all the large countries, including England and Canada, have such provisions and that the United States so far is the only nation which has failed to take the step.

'Take a Memo' Teen-Agers On the Matter of Manners

TAKE a memo, Miss Jones — or any other high school gal who wants to make good manners her business! A girl may be pretty as a picture and just as interesting to look at, but a really smooth character must also know her "pleases" and "thank yous" to have a well rounded personality. Just to keep yourself posted, remember that good manners are merely appreciation of other people's sensibilities. They are the result of training and of quick perception and innate kindness. Teach yourself to know what to do, when and how.

What is the proper way to introduce a boy to a girl?
 The most useful introduction on informal as well as formal every day occasions (and that means everything from a chance meeting in the drug store to the big junior prom) is the mere pronouncing of two names, "Miss Johnson — Mr. Jackson," or simply "Betty Johnson — Joe Jackson" if the couple being introduced are just a couple of teenage characters with whom you knock around after school hours.

What should one say when introduced?
 "How do you do?" is the accepted reply. When a fellow or gal meets some one whom he has heard much about and has long wanted to meet it would be natural to say, "I am so glad to meet you." But no matter what you see before you, hold back the hubba-hubba enthusiasm and don't say "Charmed" or "this is positively dreamy."

Should one offer to shake hands when introduced?
 This hand-to-hand, man-to-man approach is a must when fellows are introduced. But, strictly speaking, a fellow should wait for a gal to offer her hand. This is not an important rule, however, and she must of course give him her hand if he offers his.

When a fellow is walking on the street with a girl, on which side should he walk? If with two girls?
 With one girl the boy always takes the curb side of the walk, and with two girls (the lucky character!) he still takes the curb side.

What should one say to a friend's girl if he has a date the evening?

In the theater, if the couple is met by an usher, she follows first, then the boy; or if the aisle is wide they might both go down together. If they have to walk part way down the aisle to meet the usher, the fellow goes first, hands the tickets to the usher, and then stands aside for his date to go ahead, or walks with her. Is it ever proper for a girl to apply make-up or comb her hair in a restaurant or a drug store booth?

Just sit relaxed in the middle of your own seat, with no cheek-to-cheek conversations with your date, and the couple behind will enjoy the movie, too!

In leaving, who goes first?
 They leave the seats as they come. Each gentleman, however (or your evening's date, in the case may be), stands in the aisle a moment so that his gal can walk out with or ahead of him. It's little things that can make a red-letter date or just an evening that you'd like to bear out of your diary. Manners are for men, too, but it's always gals who set the pitch!
