Good Friday Bill On Albany Docket

Albany — (RNS) — A bill making Good Friday a legal holiday in New York State has been introduced into the State Senate and Assembly.

Similar measures have been sponsored in the Legislature for some years, but they have never been reported from committee. Last year the New York State Council of Churches filed a memorandum with every senator and assemblyman opposing such a proposal, on the ground it would in effect be discriminatory against Jews.

Washington — (NC) — The United States cannot in good conscience consider proposals for universal military training in peace time until it first tries to outlaw compulsory military service by international agreement, the Very Rev. Edward V. Stanford, O.S.A., Rector of the Augustinian College here, testified before the House Military Committee.

Reich Prelates Provided Plans by Card. Spellman

Rome — (RNS) — Germany's three new cardinals will travel homeward in a plane placed at their disposal by Francis Cardinal Spellman, Archbishop of New York, it was learned here. The German prelates journeyed to Rome by train for the consistory, but complained of extreme discomfort during their three-day trip.

The German cardinals — Bishop August Clemens Count von Galen of Munster, Archbishop Joseph Frings of Cologne, and Bishop Conrad von Preysing of Berlin — will leave Rome today (March 7).

Unit to Apply Papal Aims to Economy Urged

Cleveland — (NC) — Dr. Alphonse H. Clemens, of Fortbonne College, St. Louis, was elected president of the American Catholic Sociological Society at the organization's seventh annual convention here.

Other officers elected are: the Rev. Vincent McQuade, O.S.A., of Villanova College, Villanova, Pa., vice-president; Edward Marchiak, of Loyola University, Chicago, treasurer; and the Rev. Ralph A. Gellagher, S. J., also of Loyola, executive secretary. Bishop Edwin V. O'Hara of Kansas City was made honorary president.

Urging the formation of a national "Vocational Group" commission to apply the principles of Pope Pius XI's "Quadragesimo Anno" to American industrial economy, Brother Gerald J. Schnepf, S.M., retiring president of the society, recommended that one of America's industrial areas be picked for an intensive organizational campaign directed toward the establishment of the vocational group idea there.

Admitting that the realization of Pope Pius XI's program is an objective which "may take several lifetimes," Brother Schnepf counseled the Catholic sociologists to be willing to work toward their goal in piecemeal fashion and said that prayer as well as material measures should be included in the plans for its attainment.

Father Stanford spoke on behalf of a resolution by Representative Joseph W. Martin of Massachusetts, House Minority Leader, to defer action on compulsory training pending efforts to outlaw it everywhere.

"In the present unsettled state of world security," Father Stanford said, "I am convinced that as a matter of national conscience, in protest against a futile and ruinous armaments race, the United States should adopt and implement a policy which would seek an immediate international agreement whereby compulsory military service shall be wholly eliminated from the policies and practices of all nations.

"I am not impressed by those who say that there is not the slightest hope that the United States will adopt such a proposal. Even though I were willing to accept as a forgone conclusion the rejection of this proposal by other nations, I would still believe that the effort should be made. In no other way, I am convinced, can this nation in
