### Requiem for Army Pilot Offered at St. Monica's

A Memorial Requiem Mass for Lt. Daniel Fischer, 22, killed in action over Mindanao in the Philippines, was offered Monday, Mar. 4, 1946 in St. Monica's Church.

Mr. and Mrs. Daniel L. Fischer, 123 Tratalgar St., were informed that their only son was killed Apr. 14, 1945. Lt. Fischer had been listed missing since that date.

Pilot of a B-25 Mitchell bomber of the 100th Bombardment Squadron, 2nd Bomber Group, 13th Air Force, the young officer was flying his 30th mission.

He held, in addition to five battle stars, the Air Medal with clusters and was awarded the Purple Heart.

After attending St. Michael's College, Tonawanda, and Creighton University, Omaha, Neb., he had enlisted in the Army Air Forces in February, 1943.

Surviving Lt. Fischer, besides his parents, are his wife, Mrs. Jean Fischer, of Los Angeles; three sisters, Mrs. Jerome E. Baker and the Misses Rosanne and Susan; his grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Louis Fischer of Burlington, Ia., and several aunts and uncles.
