Corning—Mrs. Mrs. Hec- tor Quattre, 62 John St., this city, have received word from the War Department that their son, Sgt. Thomas J. Quattre, 23, missing since Feb. 22, 1945, is presumed dead.

Sgt. Quattre was a crew member of a C-47 Skytrain Aircraft with the Ninth Air Force on a mission from England to France when reported missing. He was based in England.

He enlisted in the Aviation Cadets at Elmira, Sept. 8, 1942. After extensive training throughout the eastern and southwestern states, he was sent overseas in 1944.

Sgt. Quattre attended St. Vincent de Paul's school, graduating in 1936 and from Northside High School in 1940. Before enlistment he was employed by Corning Glass Works.

He held the Good Conduct Medal, the European Theater Ribbon with Battle Stars, the Presidential Citation and Air Medal.
