

### Spain Women Collect 235 Tons of Clothing

Madrid — (NC) — Spanish Catholics have forwarded 235 tons of clothing to His Holiness Pope Pius XII for distribution among war victims. The Women's Council of Spanish Catholic Action launched the collection which was enthusiastically taken up by all the diocesan councils of the country. Over 136,000 pieces of clothing were donated most of them from the dioceses of Cordoba, Plasencia, Barcelona and Madrid.

The National Laymen's Retreat League with which the diocesan group is affiliated will hold its first national post-war convention in Boston on the invitation of Archbishop Cushing on June 21, 22, 23, this year. The diocesan group will be represented.
