

### WHAM Series Set To Join With Discussion Clubs

Hand in hand with the more than 300 clubs now engaged in Lenten study and discussion in Rochester diocese will be a new series of radio programs on Station WHAM, Rochester, beginning Saturday afternoon, at 2:30 p. m., March 9.

The radio program will have the same basic topic, "Sacraments" as now being discussed in the study clubs. The theme will be discussed on the radio between a priest and one of his younger parishioners.

This is the eleventh year for Discussion Clubs in the Rochester diocese, the movement having been begun by His Eminence, Cardinal Mooney when Bishop of Rochester.

#### Pamphlets Heat Out

Many of the clubs retain their same members year after year, the Rev. George Vogt, diocesan director, Co-fraternity of Christian Doctrine states. Others, he says, are starting for the first time. Pamphlets have been distributed to parishes throughout the Diocese. Father Vogt states that those who would like to join these clubs are asked to consult their pastors.

Topics discussed since the movement began are: 1936, "Ceremonies of the Mass;" 1937, "Life of Jesus;" 1938, "Godless Communism;" 1939, "Marks of the Church;" 1940, "Why All Should Go To Church;" 1941, "Redemption;" 1942, "The Bible;" 1943, "Our Parish;" 1944, "The Mass;" and 1945, "Marriage."
