# Fr. Heindl Named Chaplain At Utica Army Hospital

Utica—One of the most decorated chaplains of World War II, Capt. Elmer W. Heindl, a priest of the Rochester Diocese, has been assigned to the staff of the Rhoads General Hospital, Col. A. J. Canning, commanding officer of the hospital has announced.

Veteran of 4 years military service, Father Heindl returned to his home in Rochester last December with a Distinguished Service Cross, the Army's second highest award, a Silver Star and a Bronze Star Medal.

An alumnus of St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's seminaries, Rochester, the priest joined the Chaplain Corps in Feb., 1942, and went overseas with the 37th Division. He served in the Southwest Pacific for more than three years as chaplain of the 148th Infantry Regiment.

He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. William C. Heindl, 40 Florence Ave., Rochester. Before entering service he served as assistant pastor of St. Andrew's Church, Rochester.
