

Communion Sunday Set for Rochester K. C. Unit

His Excellency Bishop Kearney will celebrate the Communion Mass and State Deputy Joseph M. Foley of New York will speak at the Communion Breakfast of the Rochester Council, Knights of Columbus, Sunday, March 24, Grand Knight Francis T. Toomey announces.

The Communion Mass will be offered in St. Patrick's Church, Plymouth Ave., North near Brown St., at 7:45 a. m. The Bishop will be assisted by the Rev. Leo C. Mooney, pastor of St. Patrick's and a member of the Council. Taking a prominent part in the services and breakfast will be the Rev. William J. Schifferli, Council Chaplain.

Bishop Kearney will speak with State Deputy Foley on the Communion Breakfast program. Sons of the Knights will assist at the Mass and receive Holy Communion with them and attend the breakfast.

First Visit Here

This will be State Deputy Foley's first official visit to Rochester Council. He is a prominent New York City attorney and widely known as an orator. A native of New York he received his early education in St. Stephen's School, Columbian University High School and Fordham College. He is a graduate of Fordham Law School.

Before being elected head of the state organization, State Deputy Foley was chairman of New York Chapter and was chairman of the Chapter's Annual Memorial Mass, Columbus Day Program and Charity Ball.

Lecturer Raymond J. Nary is general chairman of the Mass and Breakfast with Thomas T. Fies as chairman of tickets. Raymond J. Hasanauer of Aquinas Institute faculty will have charge of music at the Mass and breakfast.

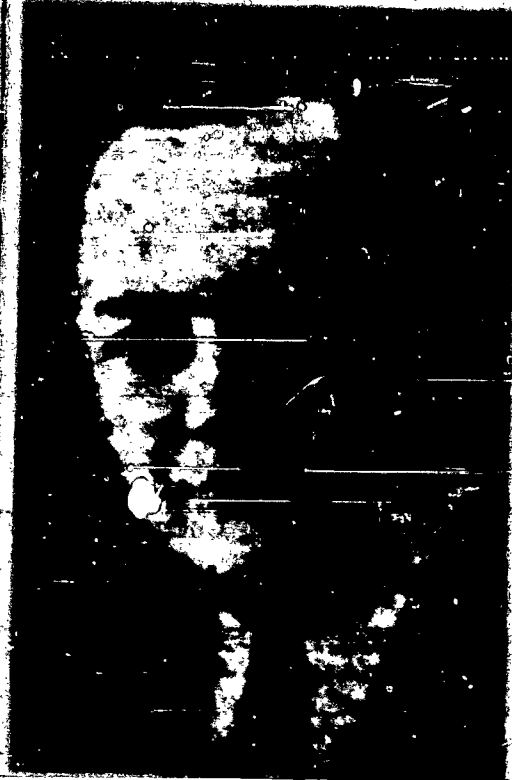
