### NCWC War Relief Food Drive Goal

New York — (RNS) — The  
Food for the War Stricken Cam-  
paign conducted by the War Rel-  
ief Services—National Catholic  
Welfare Conference, has been  
over-subscribed by 1,500,000 cans  
of foodstuffs, according to an  
interim report here. The cam-  
paign goal was 20,000,000 cans  
and 21,500,000 were received.  
Of the 22,540,000 pounds of  
food donated, about 11,220,786  
pounds already have been ship-  
ped to Poland, Italy, Belgium,  
France, Austria, Greece, Czecho-  
slovakia, Yugoslavia, China and  
the Philippines. Thus far 17,  
619,217 pounds have been packed  
for export. Further shipments to  
France, the Netherlands and Ger-  
many are awaiting clearance.

### Summer Institute Plans For Women Are Announced

Washington — Two Institutes, sponsored by the National Council of Catholic Women and the Social Action Department, National Catholic Welfare Conference, will be in session again this summer. They will be conducted simultaneously at the National Catholic School of Social Service from June 16 to 23.

The National Catholic School of Social Service is provided.

The Institute on Industry, now in its tenth year, will be attended largely by women from trade unions and organized groups or clubs of working women. The other Institute, planned for Chairmen of the Social Action Committees of the National Council of Catholic Women, will be attended by Council members seeking information on problems related to economic life. They will study current problems, pending legislation and means of stimulating interest in their own activities in their respective diocese. This will be the second Institute of its kind.

The workers' Institute will cover the history of the labor movement; collective bargaining; wages; income and prices; conciliation and arbitration, and social legislation which relates particularly to the interest of the worker and the worker's family. The other Institute will be in the way of refresher courses on the subjects of consumer interests; women in industry; full employment; minimum wages legislation; housing; and suggestions of means to make their work more effective. Joint meetings of the two groups also will be held.

A picked staff of instructors will present the moral and economic aspects of the practical problems facing both groups. Supplementing the work of the teachers, guest speakers will be heard. The program will include trips to the N.C.W.C. headquarters, to government departments, C.I.O. and A.F. of L. headquarters, the Congressional Library, the National Art Gallery and other places of interest will occupy their leisure hours.
