THE MISSION I LIKE BEST IS INDIA

Ever since I have learned about the missions of the world, India, the land of fascinating and infinite variety, has appealed to me most. St. Thomas, the Apostle, and St. Francis Xavier, India's earliest missionaries, met with many of the difficulties which the missionaries of today must overcome.

One of the greatest difficulties is the caste system of the Hindu's which makes India different from all other countries. It creates a complete division of classes, which the people of India bear uncompromisingly. These people feel that they have nothing to learn from the Christian religion and everyone who is converted is considered disloyal to his country as well as to his gods.

The great variety of languages and dialects also makes it difficult to convert these souls. Many hours of study are needed to master even one of these languages.

Density of population brings many problems to the would-be missionary, but also offers many opportunities to win the people's trust. The chief lessons of Christianity, love of God, and of our neighbors, are taught by the missionaries' care of the sick, homeless and aged. These corporal works of mercy win for the missionaries the majority of souls in the lowest caste.

Superstition and ignorance of all classes have to be overcome by the truths of nature as well as by the truth of God. Therefore education is the answer to this problem.

From all this you can see for yourself that India needs our help. We can be missionaries now by praying and offering sacrifice for the people of far-away India, and later, perhaps, we may really go there and do a larger part in winning souls for God.

Prelate Hits Soviet Secret Diplomacy

Edinburgh — (RNS) — Soviet secret diplomacy threatens the world with a catastrophe "greater and more terrible" than that of World War II, the Most Rev. Andrew Joseph McDonald, Archbishop of St. Andrews and Edinburgh, declared here in a Lenten pastoral letter.

Asserting that large numbers have been misled by lying propaganda into a belief in Communism and into supporting a policy irreconcilable with loyalty to God and country, Archbishop McDonald said that "one means alone can save us from disaster and secure for our nation lasting peace—the conversion of Russia to the Faith."

Chaplain Calls From Tokyo

That was the thrilling word received by Police Captain and Mrs. George V. Habel of 114 Thurston Rd., Rochester at 1:45 a. m. Tuesday morning. The caller was their son, Captain Raymond Habel, an Army chaplain stationed outside Tokyo. Father Habel talked with his parents for four minutes and reception on the 15,000 mile telephone conversation was reported as remarkably clear.

The call was relayed from Tokyo to St. Francis and carried by wire to New York and then to Rochester. Father Habel served as chaplain at Our Lady of Good Counsel Church, Rochester before leaving the service.

Lapsed Catholics Compared to Judas

New York — (INC) — Judas Iscariot is the archetype of all fallen away Catholics, Magr. Fulton J. Sheen, of the Catholic University of America, stated Sunday on the Catholic Hour radio program. Lapsed Catholics like Judas, he said, were once blessed with grace and divine intimacy and later abandoned it.

The Saviour's greatest enemies, Monsignor Sheen noted, are fallen away Catholics. "Christ in His Church," he said, "is delivered into the hands of the enemy from within. It is bad Catholics who betray. The scandal of 'fall-en-aways' provides opportunities for enemies who still are firm; the enemies do the bloody work of crucifixion, but those who

have communion with Christ prepare the way."

Christ's betrayal by Judas was prefaced by a kiss, the speaker pointed out, because betrayal of Divinity is such a heinous crime that it must always be preceded by some mark of affection. "Human things," he said, "we can attack without excuse; they need no pretended love to sheath the sword that kills. But in the presence of the sacred and the Divine one must feign affection where affection should be unfeigned. How many are there who attack the Church's beliefs, only because, as they say, they would keep its doctrine pure."
