Chaplain Cites Vocations Among GIs in Sodality Talk

Auburn — Many men in the armed forces have entered seminaries to prepare for the Holy Priesthood and a great number have indicated their intention to enter as soon as discharged from the services.

This information was brought by Chaplain Richard T. Tormey of the United States Navy and a priest of the Rochester diocese to members of St. Mary's Church Junior Sodality which met Tuesday evening in Lyceum Hall.

Stressing vocation to the religious life, Father Tormey spoke of the happiness in thus serving God. He described his visit to the leper colony at Molokai and told of the happiness of the priests and sisters there. He said that the priest in charge has served among the lepers for 22 years and that some of the Sisters have more than ten years of service each.

The Chaplain related his visit with the Franciscan Sisters in charge of the hospital and said that two of the nuns, Sister Carmelita and Sister Mary Margaret were at one time members of Mercy Hospital staff in Auburn.

March is vocation month and also the month during which the sodalists pay tribute to their fathers. St. Mary's Sodality received Holy Communion on Sunday morning for the intention of their fathers and on Tuesday evening recited the Little Office of the Blessed Virgin for them.

Miss Betty Brennan gave a talk on daily Mass during Lent and urged the sodalists to attend Mass every day if possible. Miss Patricia Englehart spoke of St. Blasius, the patron of borrowed articles and urged the sodalists to make a practice of returning all articles which they borrow and not to consider them as personal possessions.

Father Hickey, moderator, spoke briefly and the March meeting was brought to a close with a social hour.
