**CENTURY**

**"MASQUERADE IN MEXICO"**

(Oh, in pic.) Paramount. Angel O'Reilly (in appropriate name) while smuggling a stolen gem into Mexico from the States, plants it upon Banker Thomas Grant (Patrick Knowles) who sits next her in the plane. Banker and Angel (played by Dorothy Lamour) become friendly. Banker is unhappy with his wife (An Dvorak) who threatens to divorce him in favor of a bullfighter (Arturo de Cordova), so Angel is encouraged to compete for the bullfighter's affections.

Posing as a Spanish noblewoman, Angel gets into familiar screen complications, but eventually it is indicated the banker is willing his wife shall divorce him so that he may marry Angel. Apart from its moral discoloration, this Mitchell Leison production is barely worth a second thought as entertainment. Fancy and phony best describe it.

**RKO PALACE**

**"TOMORROW IS FOREVER"**

x (Adults) RKO Radio. Ambitiously produced but singularly unconvincing story of a World War I soldier (Orson Welles) who, though devoted to his wife (Claudette Colbert), allows her to presume him dead because he cannot face her following disfigurement in action. Many years later he returns to his home town posing as an Austrian refugee, finds his wife "re-married" to a good man (George Brent) and the mother of two sons — one by each "marriage." Although she eventually identifies him, he denies the truth and dies after telling her the present and future, not the past, hold all that matters.

Magnificently mounted and mainly well acted, (although Welles "hams" the main character), this International Film enterprise was produced by David Lewis and directed by Irving Pichel. Story development is devoid of all surprise and fails to present any valid reason for circumstances which are offered as the basis of dramatic conflict. Be-

cause spiritual considerations are dismissed as subsidiary to the physical, consequently falsity shows through from beginning to end.

**REGENT**

**"BECAUSE OF HIM"**

(Adults) Universal. A shade better than recent Durbin films, but still not the "come back" her career needs following producer Felix Jackson's rash experimentations. This time the central character, a stage-struck waitress, is shown as unscrupulous and deceived in her efforts to promote herself a stage career. Deanna Durbin is not dramatically equal to the film's later suggestions that, once she got the chance, she proved herself a great stage actress. Scenes in which she sings her way, with "Danny Boy," into the good books of a ham actor (Charles Laughton) and, with Toni's "Goodbye," breaks down objections of a playwright (Franchot Tone) are silly rather than funny. If logically contrived, more singing and less acting would have brought this nearer to the old standard of Deanna Durbin screen entertainment.
