Funeral of Edward J. Pietrowski, 25, 82nd Airborne Division veteran was conducted Thursday, Mar. 14, 1946, in St. Stanislaus Church.

A resident of West Rush, Mr. Pietrowski died Saturday, Mar. 9, 1946, in the Veterans' Hospital at Sunnyside, Tupper Lake, after a J. Pietrowski year's illness. The body was brought to the home of his sister, Mrs. Melvin Osminkowski, 340 Avery St., Rochester. Burial was in Holy Sepulchre cemetery.

Mr. Pietrowski fought in the Battle of the Bulge and in the Battle of the Bulge. Wounded in Holland, he was awarded the Purple Heart. He also wore the Combat Infantryman's Badge, the Good Conduct Medal, and the European, African Middle East theater ribbons with three battle stars.

Son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Pietrowski of West Rush, he was born in Rochester and moved there several years ago.

Surviving besides his parents and sister, are another sister, Mrs. Leo Maciejewski and a niece Joan Osminkowski.
