Rochester's next Tin Can Pick-up will take place Saturday, March 30, according to the Rochester Salvage Committee. The last tin drive, locally, was on October 13, 1945, more than five months ago. The Salvage Committee holds high hopes for a successful pick-up this time, owing to the length of time that housewives have had to accumulate their contributions.

The pick-up will follow the pattern of those previously staged in this city, with a cavalcade of trucks starting out early on the morning of March 30, manned by volunteers and raking curb collections from every address within the city limits. Plans for pick-ups at this time in the surrounding towns and villages have not yet been definitely announced, but it is expected that they will follow the lead of the city.

William T. Nolan, chairman of the Rochester Salvage Committee, expressed a fervent hope that local housewives would display the same enthusiasm and patriotism that they demonstrated so well during the wartime years.
