### The 'Tenebrae' Services OF Holy Week

The Bishop will be present on Holy Thursday afternoon for the service of Tenebrae at Sacred Heart Pro-Cathedral. It is to be sung by the entire student body of St. Bernard's Seminary, and is open to the public. It is to begin at 4 p. m. and its usual duration is two hours and ten minutes. A libretto of the Tenebrae texts will be available, costing twenty-five cents.

Tenebrae is one of the most beautiful services of the Church Year. It consists principally of singing. In fact, there is very little of sanctuary ceremony. The name of Tenebrae applies to the Matins and Lauds of the last three days of Holy Week. Formerly sung after midnight, they are now required to be undertaken on the previous evening from 4 p. m. on. This means that Holy Thursday's Tenebrae is sung on Wednesday evening; Good Friday's on Thursday; and Holy Saturday's on Friday. This is known as "anticipating" the Office.

The Matins part of Tenebrae consists of three Nocturns, each Nocturn comprising three Psalms, three Lessons, and three Responsories. The Psalms are sung by the entire assembly, the Lessons by Lectors in the sanctuary, and the Responsories by the choir. This alternation and partition of the singing affords fine contrast and variety. The Psalms all bear some prophetic reference to the suffering and pain of redemption. The Lessons of the First Nocturn are from the Lamentations of Jeremiah, and are sung with a haunting and plaintive melody; the Lessons of the Second Nocturn are from the writings of St. Augustine, and those of the Third are from the Epistles of St. Paul. Each Lesson is followed by its choral Responsory, a piece of great beauty both in text and music, whether Gregorian, polyphonic, or modern. The Responsory serves as a musical interlude allowing time for meditation upon the Lesson which it follows. Some of the greatest composers have vied with one another to write great music for these Responsories—musicians like Palestrina, Victoria, Inghelbert, and de La Rue in the time of the Renaissance. Some modern church composers, too, have written very expressive settings for these remarkable texts which lead the soul to intimately into the depths of the Savior's Passion.

After the Third Nocturn, Lauds is sung. This consists of five Psalms followed by the Canticle of Zachary (the Benedictus), the Antiphon "Christ, become obedient unto death," and lastly the great Miserere, David's great psalm of repentance. After a final Oratio, sung by the presiding priest, the lights are extinguished, a subdued cello is made by the assembly (typifying the commotion of nature at the death of the Lord), and the service is finished. (At the Pro-

cession, the Pro-Cathedral Tenebrae on Thursday which is open to the public. Good Friday afternoon's Tenebrae at the St. Bernard's Seminary chapel is open to a limited number of guests. If you are interested in coming to the latter, you are requested to call Glenwood 2646 for reservation.

### Adoration Men Hear Plea to Double Number

More "contemplative" members of the society were advocated by His Excellency, Bishop Kearney at the annual Communion Breakfast of the Nocturnal Adoration Society which drew 350 Catholic men to Powers Hotel, Passon Sunday morning.

Close to 400 men attended the Communion and Mass at St. Patrick's Church celebrated by Bishop Kearney at 7:45 a. m. The Bishop was chosen for the Adoration Mass because their practice was "like unto the watching with Christ in the Garden of Gethsemane" to be commemorated next week.

A report by Secretary Joseph W. Benn that increased attendance at the Nocturnal Adoration service has been noted was declared "gratifying" by Bishop Kearney in the principal breakfast address.

Keynote sounded by Program Chairman Theodore J. Houck who said it was "back number" to bring in new members this year. Joseph J. Albrecht was co-chairman.

Adoration demonstrates belief in the Real Presence, the Bishop said and emphasized the gift of faith. The diocese is fortunate in having the contemplative community of women, the Carmelite Sisters who make their abode at East Ave. and whose intense devotion "generate spiritual power" in the diocese.

"Their prayers are making our work successful," the Bishop said. He expressed the belief that many priests and members of other religious communities in the diocese would attest to that statement.

Resolute, essential in a limited and humble manner, the men of the Nocturnal Adoration Society too, are generating spiritual power, the Bishop asserted. They are the "contemplative laymen of the diocese."

Self-sacrifice, he said is the first essential of a member of this Society. The sacrifice entailed in rising during the night at 2 or 3 or 4 o'clock to take the 20-minute watches is more powerful than the prayers that are said.

The unusual turnout for the Mass and Breakfast, the Bishop stated is destined to bring a blessing to the movement in the diocese of Rochester. He invited the men of the Society to St. Patrick's Church, Mt. Morris is planning to inaugurate the Nocturnal Adoration practice in that community.

The Rev. Leo C. Mooney, moderator of the Society and pastor of St. Patrick's spoke of the appreciation of his parish for the monthly all-night Vigil by men from all parts of the city. Tribute to the work of Assistant Secretary James V. Taylor in increasing the monthly attendance was voiced by Secretary

**Australian Decries Russian Intrigue**

London - (INS) - Former Australian Premier William Hughes told a Liberal Party meeting here that "this and every other country has Russian agents working to undermine it."

Declaring "Nobody is intruding against Russia," he asked: "What would happen if we sent people to Russia to form Democratic Leagues? They wouldn't last 10 minutes."

He added that "we need to say to Russia in a friendly way: 'We want your friendship but we are not prepared to grovel for it.'"

Confessions will be heard from 3 to 6 that afternoon and from 7:30 to 9:30 in the evening. Old St. Mary's Church, O'Fallon, O. P. O., will have all the sermons at Holy Week services in Old St. Mary's Church. Holy Communion will be distributed on Holy Thursday at 6, 6:30, 7, 7:30 and Solemn Mass will be celebrated at 8 a. m. The Holy Hour will be conducted from 8 to 9 p. m.

The Mass of the Pre-Sanctified will be said at 12 noon on Good Friday followed by the devotion of the Seven Last Words, and the Three Hour service. Novena services will be combined with veneration of the cross and a sermon of the passion in the evening at 8 o'clock. The Blessing of the waxes and the candle will begin at 7 a. m. Confessions will begin in the afternoon at 3:30 and in the evening at 7:30.

St. Patrick's Church will hold Solemn Mass at 8 a. m. Holy Thursday. The Holy Hour for the parish will be from 8 to 9 p. m. in the evening. A Holy Hour will be held for the Nocturnal Adoration Society from 10 to 11 p. m. Beginning the Good Friday services will be the Mass of the Pre-Sanctified at 8 a. m. Stations of the Cross will be held at 3 p. m. and 8 o'clock in the evening. Holy Saturday services will begin at 6:30 a. m. and Mass will be at 8:30.

The entire membership is expected to keep the 10 to 11 p. m. Vigil on Holy Thursday night in St. Patrick's Church, to be conducted by Bishop Kearney, Secretary Day announced.
