### Masses Offered For 2 Soldiers From Diocese

A member of the Army of Occupation has been killed accidentally and a flyer who has been missing for more than a year is now presumed dead, according to War Department reports.

Memorial Mass was offered Tuesday morning in St. Michael's Church for Pfc. Bernard McGee, 18, who succumbed to injuries resulting from an airplane accident in Germany, May 2, 1945.

Son of Mr. and Mrs. John C. McGee, 143 East Ave., Pfc. McGee was a telephone operator with the Army of Occupation. A graduate of Aquinas High School, he had been overseas since November.

Surviving besides his parents are three brothers, Mr. Hugh McGee, Chamane Field, Ill.; Patrick J. McGee, 125 West Main St.; and Richard J. McGee, 125 West Main St.

Also mentioned in the War Department report is Pfc. William H. Kofsky, 24, son of Mr. and Mrs. Michael Kofsky, 187 N. E. 1st St., who has been reported missing since Sept. 30, 1944.

Memorial Mass was celebrated in St. Andrew's Church, Monday morning.

Mr. Kofsky was a B-24 bomber crew member when his plane was shot down in Europe. He was reported missing in mid-air and his fate remains a mystery.

A member of the "Jolly Rogues" squadron, he was on his 53rd mission at the time he was shot down. He was a graduate of St. Michael's School.

Besides his parents, Mr. Kofsky leaves two sisters, Mrs. Joseph Kofsky and Mrs. Margaret Kofsky, and three brothers, John, 7, and Edward, 17, Kofsky, both attending school, and Glen C. Kofsky, several years old.

### Card Spellman to Preside At Eastern Liturgy Rites

New York - (NC) - His Eminence Francis Cardinal Spellman, Archbishop of New York, will preside at the Concelebration of the Divine Liturgy of Saint Chrysostom at St. Patrick's Cathedral on Saturday, April 13, which climaxes the program of this year's Conference on Eastern Rites and Liturgies.

The Conference, which is sponsored by Fordham University, is the province of Eastern Christianity and the Byzantine-Slavonic Liturgy as used by Catholics in the Western Balkans and Carpatho-Rusians and by their descendants in this country. The topic of discussion is of particular interest this year in view of the 50th anniversary of the Union of the Ruthenian Church with Rome and the recent report of a "schism" proclaimed under Soviet pressure.

Cardinal Spellman has always shown a deep interest in the problems of Eastern Christians who are united to Rome as well as those separated from the Vatican. He is a member for the Oriental Church and national president of the Catholic Near East Welfare Association. Evidence of the various Eastern Catholic groups represented in Greater New York will assist Cardinal Spellman at the Episcopal throne. Bishop Ambrose Semsky, O.S.B.M., Auxiliary of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Diocese, will be the chief concelebrant of the Liturgy, sometimes known as the Byzantine Mass.
