A member of the Army of Occupation has been killed accidentally and a flyer who has been missing for more than a year is now presumed dead, according to War Department reports.

Memorial Mass was offered Tuesday morning in St. Monica's Church for Pfc. Bernard McGuire, 18, who was numbered 10 in injuries resulting from a vehicle accident in Germany May 2, 1944.

Son of Mr. and Mrs. John C. McGuire, 43, Post Ave., Pfc. McGuire was a typist operating with the Army of Occupation. A graduate of Aquinas Institute, he had been overseas since November.

Surviving besides his parents are three brothers, Mr. and Mrs. E. Chasut Field, Ill., Patrick F. and Richard J. of Rochester; and four sisters, Mrs. Eugene O'Keefe, Elizabeth T. Margaret M. and Rita S. McGuire of Rochester.

Deceased died by the War Department is 1st Lt. Leo W. Warren, 26, son of Mr. and Mrs. Michael Kinsky, 187 Division St., who has been reported missing since Sept. 30, 1944.

Memorial Mass was celebrated in St. Andrew's Church Monday morning.

Lt. Kofsky was plotting a B-24 bomber over Bremen when his plane suffered "heavy damage" from enemy fire exploded in midair and fell into Macarthur Strait. A member of the "Jolly Rogers" squadron, he was on his 33rd mission at the time he was listed as missing. He was a graduate of St. Michael's School.
