The deceased is survived by his mother, Mrs. Ellen Burgoy, of Corning; three sisters, Mrs. James O'Hara, Corning, Mrs. J. A. Gehra, Rochester, and Mrs. John Hallahan, Jersey Shore, Pa.

Missing Corning Sergeant Declared Dead by War Dept.

Corning—Mr. and Mrs. Frank E. Miller of 226 Sly Ave. have received word from the Government that their son, Staff Sgt. Charles C. Miller, who was reported missing in action April 2, 1945, has been officially presumed dead.
Enlisting in the Army in March 1942, Sgt. Miller went to Fort Jackson, S. C., where he trained with the 7th Infantry Division. In September, 1943, he was transferred to the Air Corps and was sent to Reno, Nev., where he attended the University of Nevada. A third transfer came to him in March 1944 when he was sent to Fort Leonard Wood, Mo., and later he was assigned to the 97th Infantry Division at Camp Cooke, Calif.
Sgt. Miller left with his Division in February, 1945, landing at Le Havre, France. While serving in Germany he was chosen on April 1, to accompany a party of men on a raiding mission across the Rhine River in enemy territory. The sergeant was wounded and he and three other wounded men were placed in a boat and an attempt was made to get them back to safety. However only one survived.
Sgt. Miller was born in Corning, the son of Frank E. and Ella Phelps Miller. He was a graduate of St. Vincent de Paul's School and Northside High School. Before entering the service he was an employe of the Corning Glass works.
In addition to his parents he is survived by one brother, Pvt. Bernard F. Miller of Fort Jackson, S. C.
A Requiem Mass was celebrated Thursday, April 11, at St. Vincent de Paul's Church in memory of the young man.
