

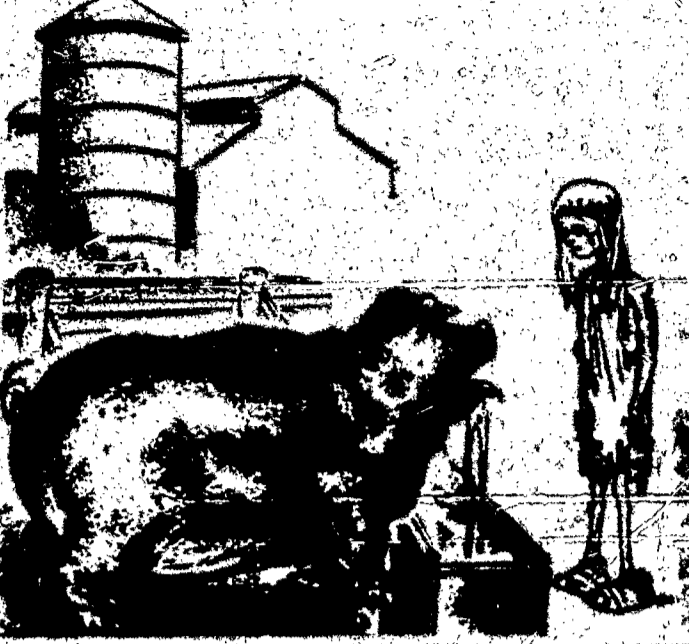
Bread—Lard—Potato Peelings in a Foxhole . . . That's Lot of Polish Children

Moscov Uses Nazi Methods Vatican Radio Charges

New York—(NC)—Russian arguments accusing the Vatican of violating the Concordat with Germany are "grossly untrue," declared the Vatican Radio. . . . "The Vatican broadcast, monitored by the Foreign Broadcast Intelligence Service, was in comment on an article in the Soviet newspaper Tass which asserted that the Vatican intended to take part openly in the political struggle of the Italian Constituent Assembly, thus violating some of the conditions of the Concordat which forbids the Vatican from interfering in the affairs of the Italian State."
