**British Women
Tells of Hunger**
Washington—(NC)—The distress of the starving populations of Europe was depicted by Lady Geraldine Rendel speaking at the National Catholic School of Social Service here, at the invitation of the National Council of Catholic Women and of the school.

After outlining the work of the British Catholic Women's League during the war, Lady Rendel told of the suffering she found on her recent visit to devastated Europe. In Berlin she saw thousands of refugees, mostly women and children, who had been deprived of all their earthly possessions and had no place to go. Unless bread can be sent to them from outside the Continent, she added, many are doomed to die.
