Editor Succeeds Father Stauder As Diocesan Holy Name Director

Dansville - A strong plea for the "total dedication of their manhood" to the cause of Christ was the keynote message made to over 200 delegates attending the Rochester Diocesan Holy Name Convention here Sunday.

Keynote speaker was the Rev. Dr. Robert E. Dillon, vice-chancellor of the Syracuse Diocese. The Rev. F. William Stauder announced to the delegates his resignation as Spiritual Director of the Diocesan Holy Name Union, which he has guided since its inception 13 years ago.

Father Stauder introduced as his successor the Rev. Patrick J. Flynn, associate editor of the COURIER-JOURNAL.

B. Edward Sheelinger, member of the Executive Board of the Diocesan Holy Name Union and a past president, proposed a testimonial to Father Stauder in appreciation of his Holy Name work. The resolution was adopted unanimously by the convention.

Dr. Florack Continues

The Rev. Arthur F. Florack, who has been associated with Father Stauder as the Assistant Spiritual Director of the Diocesan Holy Name Union since its formation in 1932, also expressed his desire to resign but promised to continue his services for another year.

Holy Name Men's Unity Credited to Founder

In the national field the prestige of Rochester Diocesan Holy Name Union can be attributed largely to one man, the Rev. F. William Stauder who is turning over the post of diocesan director, after 14 fruitful years to the Rev. Patrick J. Flynn, associate editor, Courier-Journal.

This is the consensus of lay leaders of the diocese who have worked with Father Stauder as diocesan Holy Name leaders. They point to the Union's achievements down through the years in the Holy Name program, in the promotion of laymen's devotion, advancement of the diocesan Catholic press and in the campaign against indecent literature.

When the late Bishop O'Hara was seeking a priest to lead a proposed union of all Holy Name Societies in the diocese he chose Father Stauder, then and now, pastor of Holy Redeemer Church, Fallsburg.

Result was a rally at Rochester's Red Wing Stadium on June 12, 1932 which brought out over 15,000 men. Dedicated to the Holy Name Society in the campaign for decent literature.

"It is my prayer and hope that while you may not receive much reward for your work you will remember that you have given a cup of water given in my name will go unrewarded," Father Conway said.

In congratulating the nurses, Dean Conway said: "Long before entering training you thought seriously of the step you were taking. It was not the glamour of the uniform that attracted you but the feeling that you had in your hearts and eyes."

"Nursing is a necessary and difficult profession. The physical effort is hard, and it is hard also because you are dealing with human nature at its worst. You will be dealing with sick people, not normal people."

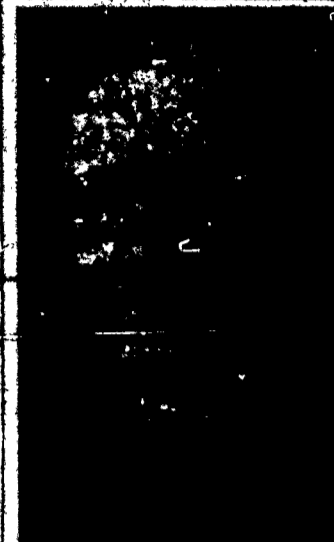
