Funds raised by these performances will go toward the erection of a new co-op house on the campus. The public is cordially invited to attend this all-student production and tickets will be on sale at the door.

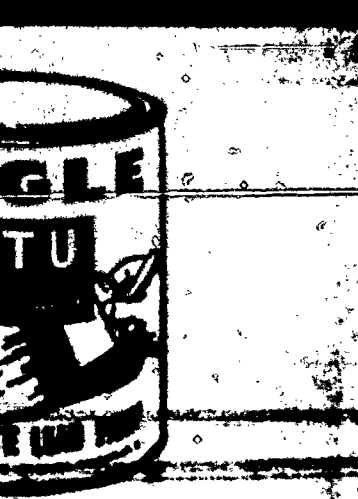
### Card Party Thursday At SS. Peter and Paul's
