Hopalong Cassidy is not well liked in his own country. In his general way the celebrated actor who readily sunk his own identity in the character of the popular Western movie hero, takes to task all the Hollywood producers with a would vitiate the one remaining film theme which breathes the sweetness of the open air.

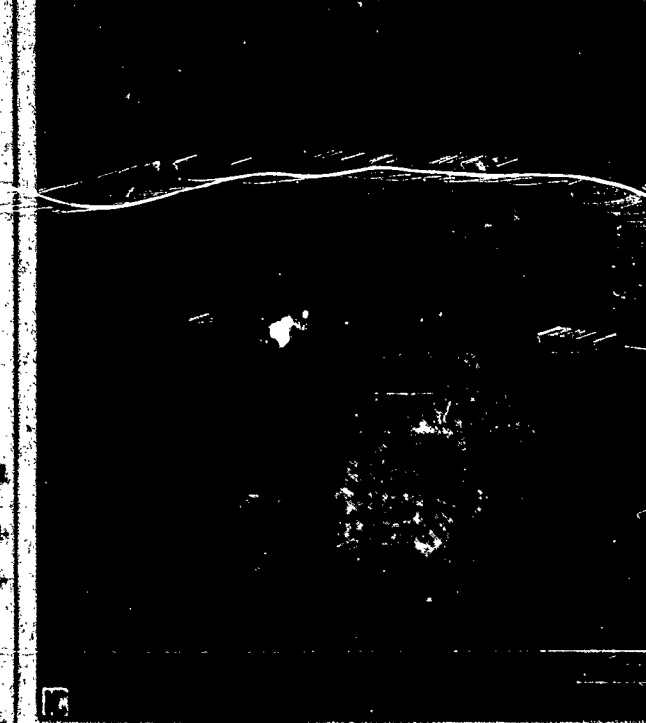

Press Group Will Hear Abp. Cushing

Boston (AP) — About 100 representatives from the nation's leading Catholic newspapers, magazines and other publications will attend the annual convention of the Catholic Press Association of the United States here from May 23 to 25.

The sessions will be opened with a Solemn Pontifical Mass, offered by Archbishop Richard J. Cushing of Boston on May 23 at the Eucharistic Shrine of Perpetual Adoration in Boston's Back Bay.

Following the first vesting meeting Simon Balducci, managing editor of Extension, Catholic monthly magazine, will be the speaker at a luncheon session.

A highlight of the convention will be a dinner on the evening of May 23 in the Copley Plaza Hotel. Archbishop Cushing will deliver the principal address.

It is expected that 800 persons, including representatives from many of the Anglo-American organizations, will attend.

Archbishop John Gregory Murray of St. Paul, Episcopal Chairman of the Press Department, National Catholic Welfare Conference, will deliver the principal address at the sessions on May 24.

Other speakers at the Friday sessions will include Richard Reid, editor of The Catholic News of New York; Frank A. Hall, Director of the N.C.W.C. News Service; the Rev. Hyacinth Blocker, O.F.M., editor of St. Anthony Messenger; and Joseph Gelin, of the Catholic Press Union, Cleveland.

discussion we had after reading of the prepared statement. We all asked questions; I myself asked him "What can we do to promote world peace?" and he answered "Do all you can to instill Christian principles into the hearts and minds of your people! He was extremely affable, and answered all our questions readily.

"Just as we were leaving the room he called me by name and asked me to remain a few moments longer. I had mentioned my personal friendship with Cardinal Mooney when I was presented, and the Pope wished to speak to me about the Cardinal. I am very deeply concerned about Cardinal Mooney's health," he said, "and would like to have reports of his actual condition."

"I promised I would let him know, and I will, as soon as I have an answer to my letter of inquiry.

"My own impression of Pope Pius is very simple: I can say honestly that I have met a lot of people, and he is by far the sweetest and most charming man I have ever met. Even now when I remember his handshake, the way he took my hand in both of his, I feel genuinely thrilled. It was an experience I shall never forget."

Speaking of the political situation, Mr. Gannett said that in his opinion the whole future would be determined by the course of events in Central Europe during the next year or two, and that the prospects for World War III depend mainly on what happens there. American and democratic influence generally, he felt, had been impaired by the

near similar conditions prevailing in U. S.-occupied territory: "I can say nothing about Russian-occupied territory, of course, since we were informed by our own High Command that we had absolutely no possible chance of being allowed to enter there. How well the Russians guard against intrusion can be gauged by the fact that the plane carrying us was attacked when it accidentally happened to pass over Russian territory."

Relations, he added, seemed everywhere to be extremely tense. "In fact, in my opinion, our own occupation commanders and our

High Command generally, are handling our leadership, to say the least. I cannot say, however, why this should be so."
