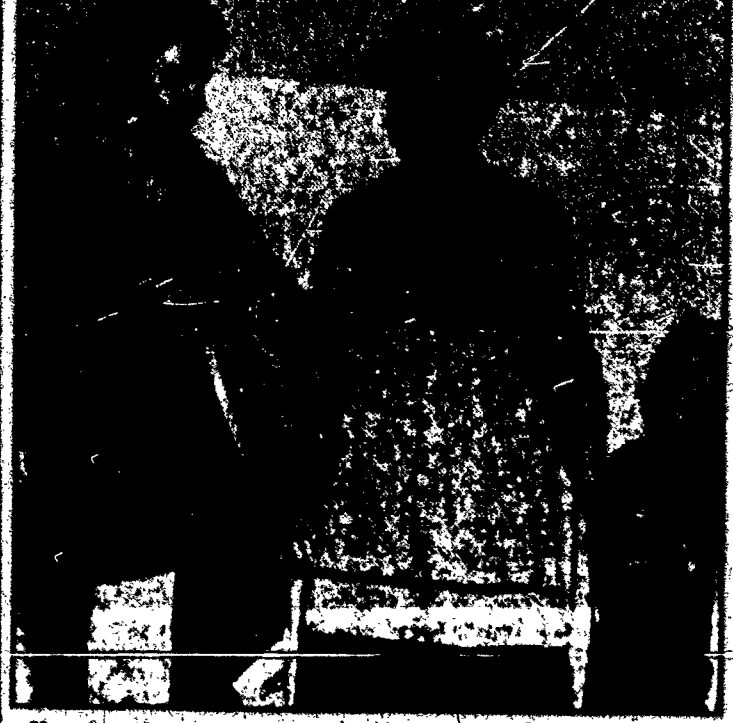

The graduating class of St. Monica's School presented a musical entertainment for their parents and friends Friday evening, May 16, in the parish hall.

The first number consisted of an original concept play entitled "Meet Stephen Foster." This play was presented in connection with the Music Appreciation course in the classroom to honor the 120th anniversary of the birth of Stephen Foster. The main idea of the play was to show the value and influence of such a course in the lives of children.

The first scene depicted a group of boys and girls who called themselves the Jolly Jugglers. While planning a "frazz" program to be given at school, they became greatly interested in a sample appreciation course devoted to Stephen Foster and changed their number to a dramatization of the songs of this great composer. In the second scene, the characters of "My Old Kentucky Home," "Jeannie With the Light Brown Hair," "Old Black Joe," "Beautiful Dreamer," "Oh, Susanna," "Come Where My Love Lies Dreaming," and "Old Fannie at Home" came to life once again. A clerical speech group gave a splendid rendition of America's Heritage, written about Foster.

The second part of the entertainment was composed of six choral numbers: "Regina coeli Jubila" by Praetorius, "My Donkey Diocese," an Italian folk song, "The Magic of Music" by Mozart, "The Musical Heart" a German folk song, "The Bluebirds" by McLaughlin, and "Frazz" by Slicker which were sung very beautifully by the eighth grade girls and boys. 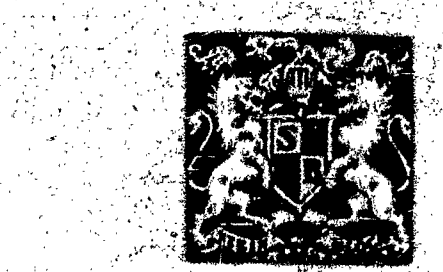
