Hollywood Gives Red Light to 'Amber' Film

When "Amber" gets the red light, that is news! What the public doubtless would like to know is the real reason behind the sudden halt in production of the screenplay. The answer is right there. Under the Production Code it was necessary to take out the bludge, with the result that the film producers had nothing left but the title. They had hoped to achieve verisimilitude by casting and direction, but by chance they chose for the part of "Amber," a young actress named Peggy Cummins.

The movie business is in the grips of a battle with the literal. The big publishing concerns force books on to the market and then foil the film rights upon Hollywood at fabulous prices. Now they are trying to force film producers to grant them sharing rights in film profits so that authors and publishers can collect fortunes, even after a story has been sold at a good price for the screen.

George Sidney is not a Catholic, but he is one of many among the Hollywood people who enjoys making films that can elevate as well as entertain. To his credit, he turned down all these new "novels."

The value of constructive Catholic action in Hollywood is aptly illustrated by recent events. When there appeared in the Los Angeles press suggestive advertising in connection with the current Columbia film "Gilda," the columnist, acting as motion picture editor of the Los Angeles Times, lodged a protest with the film company.

Tokyo — (NC) — Over the airwaves of Japan and Korea every Sunday afternoon an American voice says: "This is the Catholic Hour." Then a hymn to the Sacred Heart opens the weekly Catholic program which originates in Station WYPR in the metropolitan Radio Tokyo building here and is carried by the Armed Forces Radio Network, comprising stations in the islands of Japan and in Korea.

After a short broadcast of Catholic news, prepared from releases furnished from Washington by the N.C.W.C. News Service to its correspondent here, a chaplain delivers an address. Capt. W. A. Flynn, a St. Louis priest, and Capt. Edward J. Lambert of Dubuque, both Army chaplains, have been directing the half-hour program. Catholic chaplains in the Tokyo area take turns as news broadcasters and main speakers.
