RITES HELD FOR T. J. BRENNAN

Solemn funeral services for Thomas J. Brennan, father of two priests and brother of a nun, were conducted Monday, May 13, 1948, in Holy Rosary Church. Mr. Brennan died Friday, May 10, 1946, at his home, 89 Selva Ter., Rochester.

The Solemn Requiem Mass was offered by one of his sons, the Rev. Thomas J. Brennan, assisted by the Rev. Vincent Davis, S.L.C.C. as deacon, and the Rev. John Whalen, as subdeacon. His Excellency, Bishop Kearney imparted the final absolution.

Concentration Camp Liberation Marked

Mass was offered at the Cathedral of Notre Dame here on the anniversary of the liberation of the Buchenwald concentration camp by the American Army.

Surviving besides the two priests and nun are Mr. Brennan's widow, Mrs. Agnes Conway Brennan; two daughters, Mrs. Mary Adelaide Brennan; four other sons, Herbert V. Brennan, J. Paul Brennan, Donald J. Brennan, and Edward R. Brennan of Rochester; another sister, Mrs. John Scherer of Rochester, and 15 grandchildren.



Q. A former WAC writes that she is about to open a small retail shop and her income for the first few months will be slight. She asks if she can apply for a weekly allowance to help out until she is better established in her business.

A. Any month during which your personal income from your shop is less than \$100 you will be eligible for a readjustment allowance. You should make application at the U. S. Employment Office. They will pay the difference between your income and \$100 a month.

Q. My son attended school from February to October, 1944, as a member of Army Reserve Corps after which he became an enlisted man and then his pay decreased. How does his school time figure toward his discharge bonus?

A. As your son was not an active pay status during that time he attended school, that period of time does not count in figuring his points for discharge.

Q. I have relinquished or lost my discharge papers and understand it will take a little while to get a duplicate of my discharge from the Army. How can I apply for a readjustment allowance, when there is a discharge in progress of the Veterans Administration?

A. In making application at the Veterans Administration submit a Veterans Statement as to the loss of your discharge papers. Also submit your full name, present address, your Army serial number, place of your discharge and place where you were discharged. Your local Draft Board may also be able to furnish you with a receipt of your papers from letters which is forwarded to them.

Q. I was readjusted by the G.I. Bill and had my first home purchased in which the mortgage is paid by me. I have since been discharged from the Army and have been in the service of the G.I. Bill for some time. Will I be able to have the first 25 weeks' compensation, provided the mortgage is paid?
