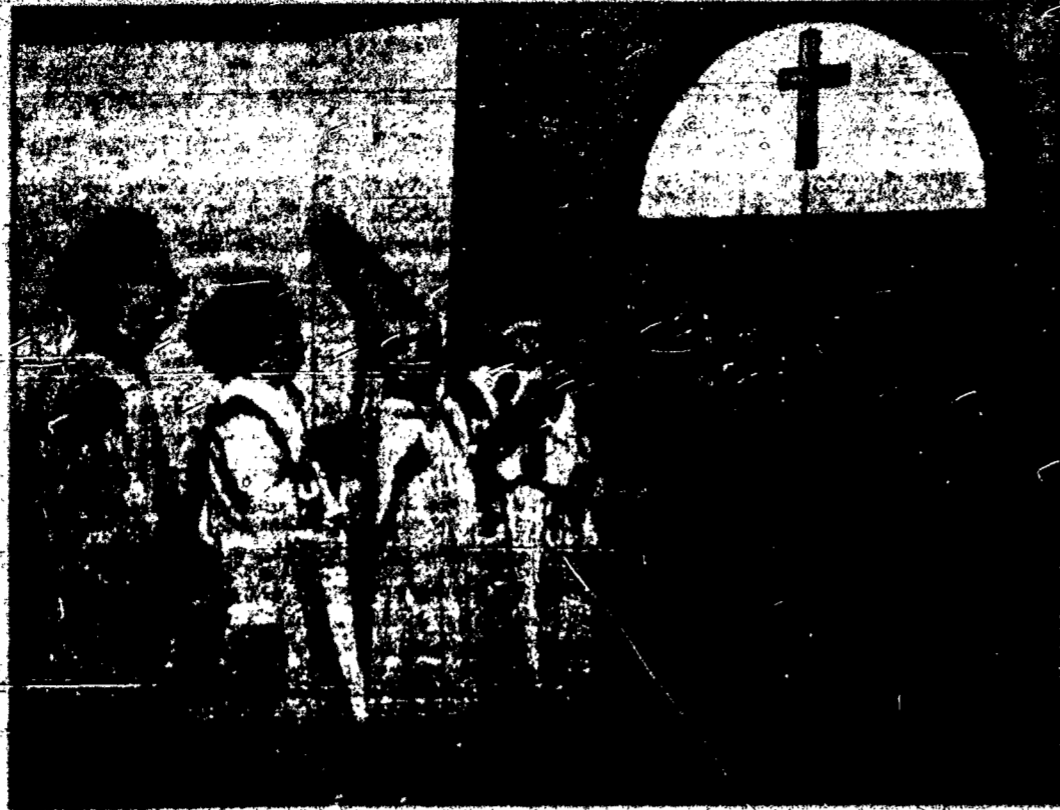


'New St. Anthony's is Blessed'

\$575 in Bonds Given St. Anthony's Pastor

Seven hundred parishioners of St. Anthony's, Elmira, joyfully welcomed school children of the parish present their pastor, Rev. Albert L. Simonetti, with \$575 in government bonds for the church building fund Sunday.

Presentations of the bonds, money for which was raised by the children themselves, was accompanied by a striking "dedication" of the new St. Anthony's with school boys and girls taking all the parts up to and including that of the "bishop" who delivered a spirited and moving address to the audience.

Setting of the presentation was performance of a production described by the audience as "one of the most clever and unusual witnessed in many years" and entitled "The Bible of St. Anthony's" in which all parts were taken by the school children under the direction of the pastor, Rev. Simonetti.

Most notable scenes of the four-act musical was "Meetings of the Clergy" in which the children performed a dance routine with fantastic precision, drawing prolonged applause from the capacity audience.

During the same period, the pastor, the pastor had five adults baptized and received 107 abandoned babies. Children are frequently found along the roadside or brought to the orphanage by native Catholics, the pastor said. The girls who survive remain at the orphanage until they are about 12 years of age or ready to take up their lives as workers. During the five years prior to the mass-baptism war, 1,000 babies were received and baptized, the pastor said.

56 Latin Americans At Notre Dame

Notre Dame — (CNC) — Continuing long-standing Inter-American cultural and educational relations, the University of Notre Dame currently has enrolled 56 Latin-American students for the Spring semester. Puerto Rico, Mexico and Cuba and eleven Central and South American republics are represented.

Ecuador leads in representation with 12 students enrolled. Six of the Latin-American students are from Puerto Rico, while Cuba, Mexico and Peru each has five representatives. Guatemala and Panama each has four; El Salvador, three; Nicaragua, two; and Colombia, Venezuela and Honduras one each. The other five are Mexican-American students who live in the United States along the Mexican border.

Ekimo's Religion Seen Well Established

Buffalo — (RNS) — Most Rev. Arsene Torquetti, O.M.I. of Washington, D. C., who was the first Catholic priest to be sent to the Far North, believes the Church there has opened the minds of the Eskimo to religion and has proved a strong civilizing influence.

"When I went up there 43 years ago most natives hadn't heard of God," he said. "Today the Church is firmly established. About one-sixth of the 6,500 natives who live in the 1,600,000 square-mile area are affiliated with the Church, he explained.
