39 French Jesuits Died in War
Paris — (NC) — Thirty-nine French Jesuits died between 1940 and 1945 as a result of the war, it has been disclosed here. Seven members of the Society died while being deported by the Nazis, one was shot by the Gestapo and two others died in imprisonment. Twenty-three were killed on the battlefield and six were victims of bombardments.

Clean Conduct Code Asked for Filmfolk

There comes from a relatively obscure film actor named Eddie Rocco a proposal that the Screen Actors Guild set up a Clean Conduct Code to control the off-stage behavior of movie actors. Some actors and even some movie celebrities who are not actors — have come to regard it a public brawl and scandal as a nifty way into public life. They could not make by virtue of artistic performances. Mr. Rocco's idea therefore deserves a respectful attention. He points out that a few members of the Screen Actors Guild have "conducted themselves so as to discredit the entire motion picture industry."

Picture Parade

The following reviews give William H. Moorings' estimate of the entertainment value of new motion pictures. *** indicates an Outstanding picture. ** Excellent. * Good. Satisfactory. * Week. Legion of Decency listing of the same picture is shown in parentheses.

"GILDA" (Ob.) In part Columbia. Here is another story about low characters with too much money and too few moral scruples. It is, however, extremely well acted with Rita Hayworth, Glenn Ford (just back from the army) and George Macready in the chief roles. Gilda (Hayworth) becomes the "bought wife" of a big boss gambler (Macready) who hires Johnny (Glenn Ford) in his casino. Johnny and Gilda have been lovers, and most of the story tells how they play against each other just to prove they're still in love. One of Gilda's lines very obviously should have been cut.

"THE BLUE DAHLIA" (Adults) Paramount. Fairly exciting murder mystery based on the rehabilitation theme with a cooked-up ending that all but spoils the whole. A young officer (Alan Ladd) returns to find his wife has been unfaithful, has lost their son through neglect, and no longer loves him. She is murdered. The rest of the story is taken up with detection of the murderer. Husband is suspected. So is her lover (Howard DeSilva). So is the young husband's army buddy (William Bendix).

"A STOLEN LIFE" (Adults) Warner. Betis Davis is at her best in the dual role of twin sisters, both in love with the same man (Glenn Ford). He marries one of them and when she is lost in a boating accident, the other contemplates poisoning the husband instead of sister-in-law. They are so much alike that even the husband can tell them apart! However, strange disclosures it would be unfair to relate, prevent any such immoral masquerade and the surviving sister eventually discovers it was she and not her sister that the young man loved all the time. This may sound somewhat trite and in poor taste, but direction by Curtis Bernheim and skillful adaptation by Catherine Turney and Margaret Bull Wilder overcome the limitations. Good supporting players include Walter Brennan, Charlie Ruggles and Dane Clark.

He was born 77 years ago in Charlestown, County Mayo, which is also the birth-place of his cousin, Archbishop Michael O'Doherty of Manila.

Moderates Win Reich Vote; Reds Far Behind

Munich — (NC) — German voters have once more repudiated Communism and all other forms of radicalism by casting their ballots overwhelmingly in favor of the Christian-Democratic party at the municipal council elections held in 50 cities with populations of over 20,000 throughout the Aegionan zone of occupation. In Bavaria — where the leader of the Catholic-supported Christian Social Union, Fritz Schaeflin, had been removed from the post of Minister President last year under the influence of leftist circles in the United States — the Christian Social Union elected 300 of its candidates, against 200 Social Democrats, 20 Communists and 80 candidates of minor groups. It will be recalled that the same leftist circles caused the late Gen. George Patton to be relieved from his office as Military Governor of Bavaria, charged with being favorable to "reactionary forces."
