

PROFESSOR WINS 1946 VILLANOVA SCIENCE AWARD

Villanova, Pa. — (NC) — Dr. John C. Hubbard of Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore, an authority on ultrasonics — the science of high frequency sound waves — is the 1946 winner of the Mendel Medal awarded by Villanova College. It has been announced by the Very Rev. Francis X. N. McGuire, O.S.A., president of the college.

The Mendel Medal was founded by Villanova College in 1928 in honor of the Austrian Abbot whose scientific research resulted in the Mendelian Laws of Heredity. It is awarded to outstanding Catholic scientists whose work has advanced the science of the same field. It has been announced that there is no conflict between true science and religion.

Dr. Hubbard, chairman of undergraduate physics at Johns Hopkins University and a member of the faculty for 18 years, has gained world-wide fame for his research in high frequency sound waves. He has developed instruments capable of measuring distances as small as one hundred millionth of an inch. He has also investigated many of the unusual biological and chemical effects produced by high frequency sound waves. He has devised a method to homogenize milk and give all its benefit to the health of thousands of infants.
